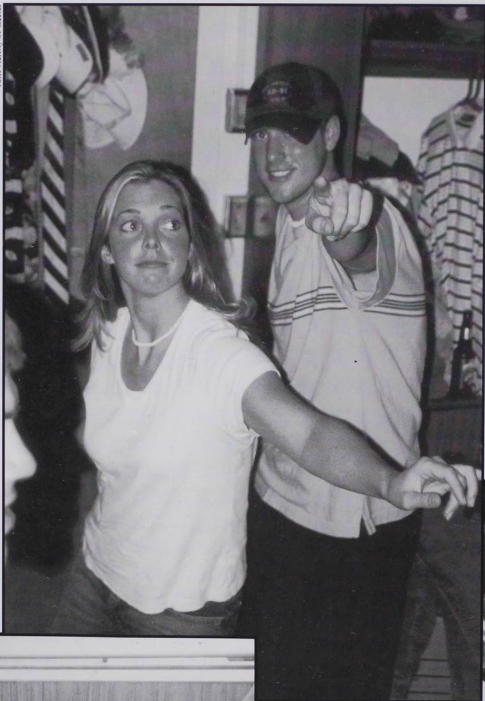

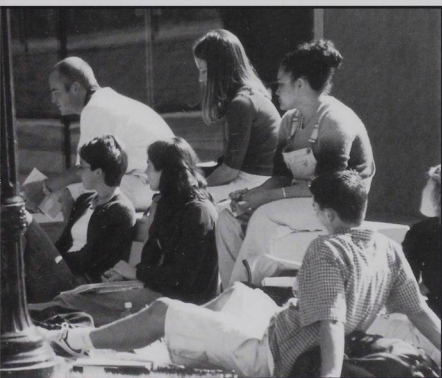

Lucky that it was sunny in Oregon, Alumni gather under a tent in Jackson Plaza for a dessert function.

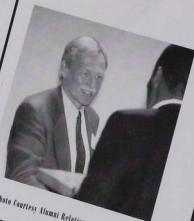

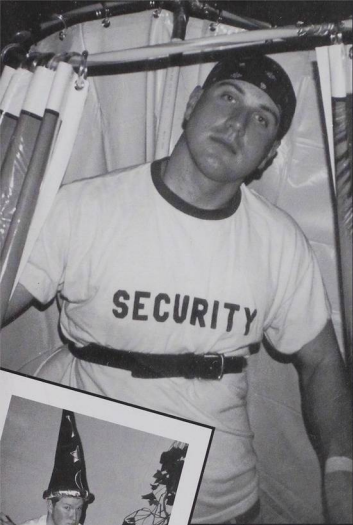

WHEN WINNING IS NOT ENOUGH...

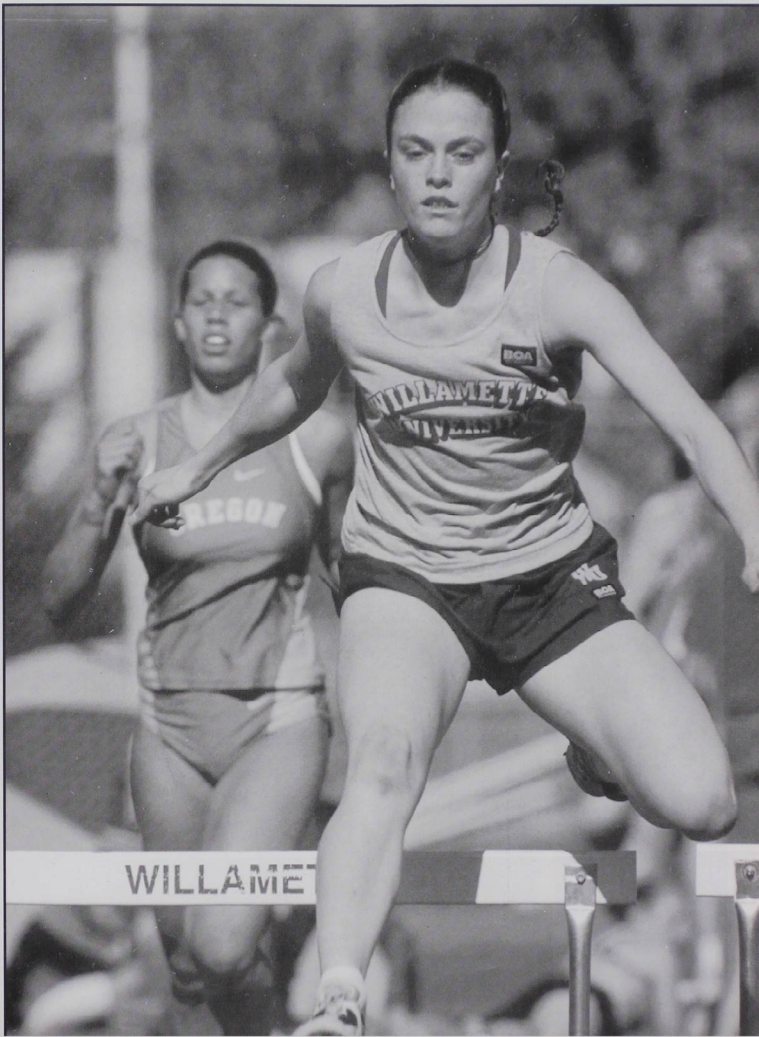

The girls team won the Northwest Conference for the first time in school history. Then went on to Chico, California to win Regionals. From Regionals the ladies traveled to Spokane, Washington for Nationals. Again these ladies would show the rest of the field why they won their region. Led by Senior captain Lisa Starkey the lady Bearcats would place 22nd overall.

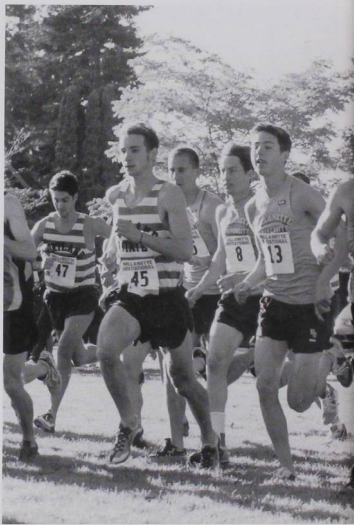
Like the ladies the mens' season was also a major success. They too are a young team that had eleven freshmen running this year. They improved on last years performance at Conference and claimed 3rd place overall. They too qualified for regionals where like Conference they claimed 3rd place. The Bearcat men also sent two men to Nationals both

Both the men and women teams look to have bright futures ahead. As the women will be returning over 30 lady Bearcats and the men will have 16 returners. Next year these teams will both look to make major strides at Nationals.

CONTINUED DOMINANCE

Once again expectations ran high for the Bearcat Women's soccer team. As head coach Jim Tursi explains, "Coming into the season we expected to qualify for the NCAA tournament." Coach Tursi's expectations came true when the Bearcat women advanced to the playoffs after receiving an at large bid. After a first round bye Willamette hosted the second and third round playoff games. The first game was against a tough Cal Lutheran who played well before Junior forward Buffy Morris scored two goals to lead the team to a 2-0 victory. The next day in a re-match against Chapman, who

they had tied earlier in the season, and in front of a large home crowd the Bearcats again found a way to win. Both teams battled well into the second half until Freshman Anne Merten scored the winning goal with just under two minutes to play. The season ended the following week with a loss against Trinity, but overall it was a strong playoff run. To get into the playoffs the Bearcats had another great season finishing 19-3-1. First team nominees Morris and Merten at forward led the league's best offense along with Senior midfielder Dana Christopherson and speedy Senior winger Jenny Bellone.

The league's best defense was anchored by two second team all league nominations, Junior sweeper Karen Heaston and Senior marking back Erin Moore. The Bearcats will miss the four senior co-captains next year, Bellone, Christopherson, Moore and Jenny Frankel-Reed, but will look to make another run into the playoffs."

Co-captains Scott Tomlins and Kenji Wright, who along with David Pietrok were the only seniors led a young squad that included twelve freshmen. The team fought hard and contested every game down to the wire as shown by six overtime games.

The season started in California with a bang, a 4-0 win over Whittier College highlighted Tomlins' hat trick. After dropping two games the Bearcats opened a six game homestand with a 1-0 win against Cal Lutheran. The team won their next game also, a close 3-2 victory over Chapman. After dropping two more games the team went undefeated over their next six games. The highlight of this run was a hat trick by Ricardo Sanchez that led to a 4-2 win over George Fox and earned him Conference Player of the Week honors. During the middle of the season the team began to gel as Coach Tursi commented, "The second half of the season the team received more respect from the opposing teams because of their ability to score goals." After playing their way back into playoff contention the Bearcats proceeded to lose

three straight. Playing for pride in the last weekend the Bearcats came out strong with two impressive wins over George Fox and Pacific before losing to Linfield. Ben DeSanno's four goals highlighted the weekend and earned him Player of the Week honors. Putting the season in perspective Tomlins comments, "We showed that we could play with anybody and set higher expectations for next year."

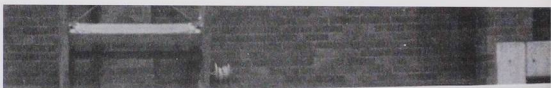

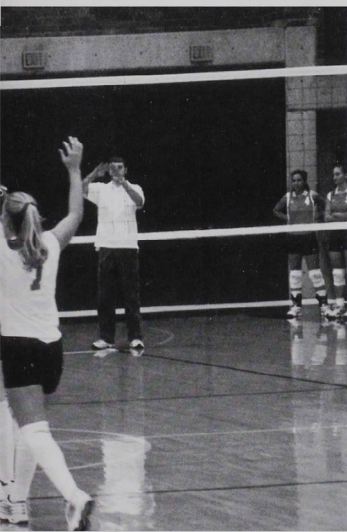
But our Conference still does not get any National respect." Only one team from our Conference went on to National play and that was the 9th ranked team in the Nation UPS.

With the toughest schedule of any team in the Conference, including three teams ranked in the top ten, the Bearcats were unable to overcome all of the setbacks. As Coach Speckman stated, "It was disappointing from a win/loss standpoint, but with all the adversity it was fun to see guys step up and play."

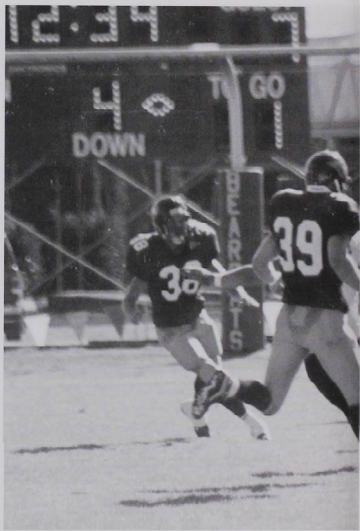
When the team was healthy it showed what kind of season it might have been. In the season opener they beat Chapman University 32-20 on the road. Despite winning the Conference title the previous year the Bearcats had not been able to defeat Southern Oregon. They made up for it this year with a dramatic triple overtime win at home. Two weeks later the team played Eastern Oregon, another team that had beat them the previous

year. This time the team played one of its best games according to Senior Andy Miguel who said, "Against Eastern Oregon the team started to gel and the offense finally caught up to the defense scoring 34 points."

Next year the Bearcats look to return to their winning ways with so many players getting a chance to play this season.

READY OR NOT

Here they come. As you may have noticed the new sport on campus this year is men's lacrosse. Normally thought of as an East Coast sport, lacrosse is starting to make its way westward. What started out as only a few guys practicing at the beginning of the year turned into a full fledged team by the spring semester. The team will play in the second division of the Pacific Northwest Collegiate Lacrosse League. The other teams in their division are Oregon State, Puget Sound, Linfield and Gonzaga. They will play each of these teams twice during the season followed by a postseason tournament.

The game of lacrosse is a combination of hockey and basketball played on a soccer field. The players wear shoulder pads, use a small rubber ball the size of a baseball and have a stick to catch and throw the ball. The field is roughly 110 x 70 yards and each team has ten players on the field including a goalie. Fouls committed by players such as slashing are penalized by a power play for the other team, similar to hockey.

Despite a lack of experience the Willamette players are looking forward to

the season and the new sport. As Junior Duncan Libby who plays attack says, "It's something new and exciting and is considered the fastest game on two feet." As Peter West who has played before says, "The first year will mainly be getting the fundamentals and mechanics down, but we plan on surprising a few teams."

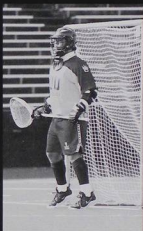

The Willamette swimming teams are looking for a strong finish to the season at the conference championships, after having battled throughout the regular season. With two meets left to go in the season the men's team is fifth in the conference at 1-3 while the women's team sits at third in the conference at 2-2. Both teams are coming off impressive wins over Whitman. Despite the average results so far, the teams can still win the conference titles if they win the conference meet.

The two teams began their rigorous training schedule during the first semester.

In October they started their morning practices which continued all the way through January. During this stretch the team would practice twice a day three times a week. PLAYOFF BOUND

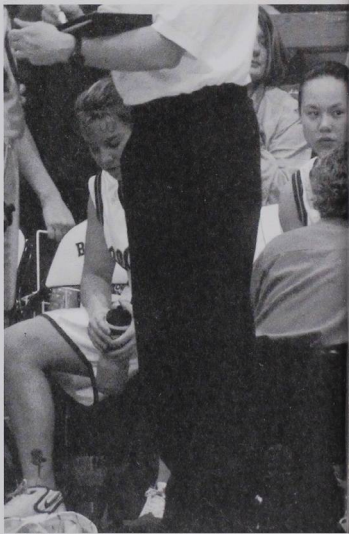
The Bearcats topped off a strong season with a berth in the three team NWC playoffs. They played PLU on the road and hung close at half time only down by seven. Early in the second half they took the lead at 37-36 before PLU went on a 13-1 run that finished off the Bearcats and a strong season.

Willamette started off the pre-season strong by going 4-1 and winning the Colorado College Thanksgiving Invitational. The momentum carried the team into the regular season where they won their first two games against Puget Sound and Linfield. After dropping their next four games the Bearcats won nine of their next ten games before they faced the number one ranked team in the nation, George Fox. Playing without the Conference's leading scorer Kelly Sorenson, the Bearcats found a way to keep the game close and were tied at 52 with just over four minutes remaining. The Bearcats then went on a seven point run to lead 59-52 with just under two minutes remaining and then hung on

for dear life. Willamette was held scoreless the rest of the game, but managed to pull out the win 59-56. As Katie Edmonds put it, "It (the win) was one of our biggest accomplishments all season and everyone's contribution helped us win."

With eight freshmen on the team the Bearcats will look to have another strong season next year, but will miss seniors Stevie Spaulding, Sorenson, Gina Pieretti, Edmonds and Heather Ludwig.

The final game of the regular season against PLU summed up one of the unluckiest seasons ever for the Willamette men's basketball team. The Bearcats led by two points with just over a second left in the second overtime. PLU inbounded the ball from the baseline and had it tipped before one of their players grabbed it and threw up a 30-foot desperation shot that banked in at the buzzer.

All year long the Bearcats found themselves on the bubble of the playoff picture. Every time they needed a win they found themselves looking at the short end of the score of another overtime

game. First the Bearcats battled Concordia (MN) to four overtimes before falling 109-107. Nine games later the Bearcats played George Fox to two overtimes before losing 106-104. Three games later Willamette hosted Whitworth and again found themselves in an overtime game and again lost by two points. As Senior Kip Ioane put it, "It was extremely tough being a Senior and losing the close games, but the guys are young and will win those games next year.

Despite the close losses the Bearcats still had a strong season putting up a 10-14 record overall. The season will always be remembered for the stellar shooting of Senior Nik Lubisich. He twice tied the Willamette record with nine threes pointers in a game and led the league in scoring average. Another cornerstone of the team was Senior Ioane who was a Captain the past two years and will be missed next year.

THE GIVING DAY

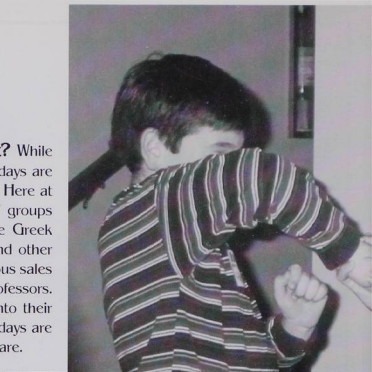

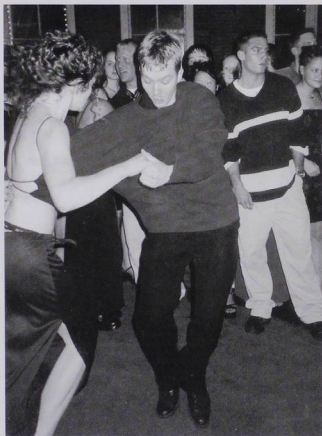

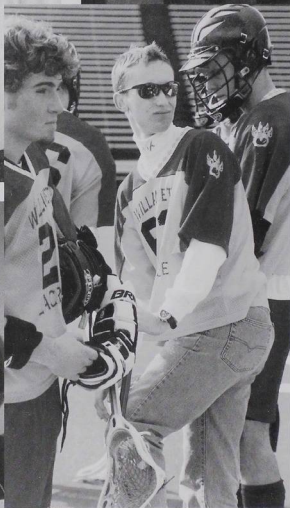

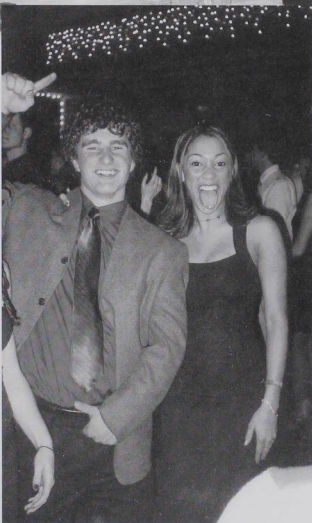


FORMAL DAYZ

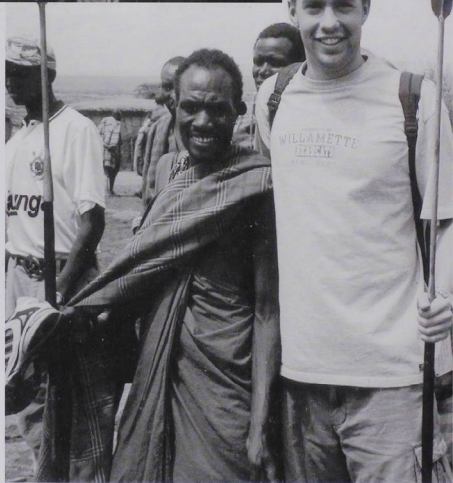

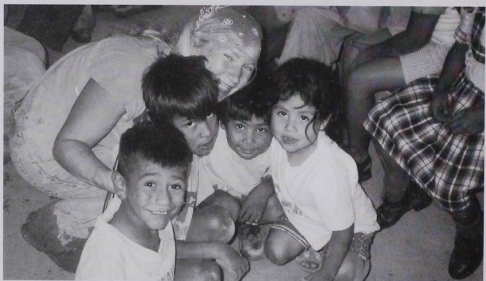

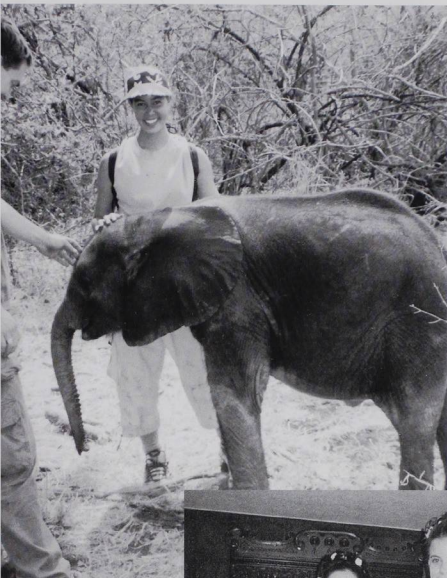

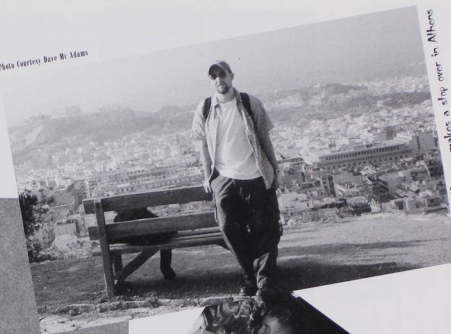

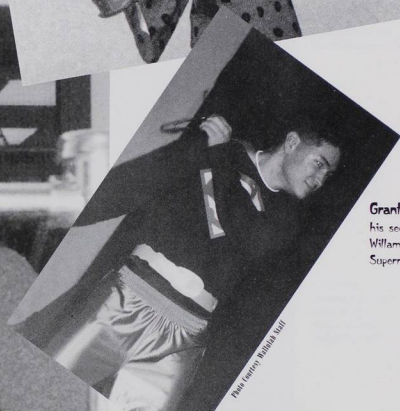

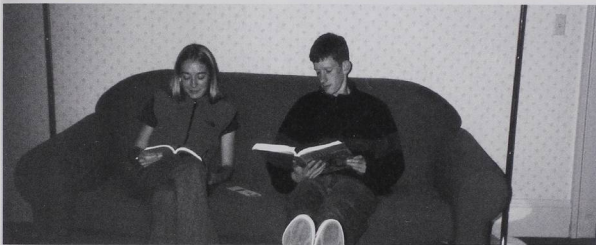

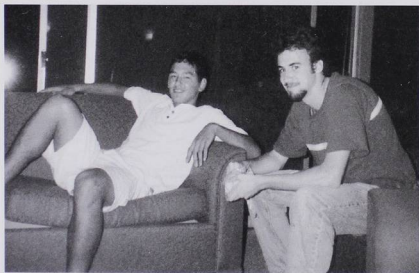

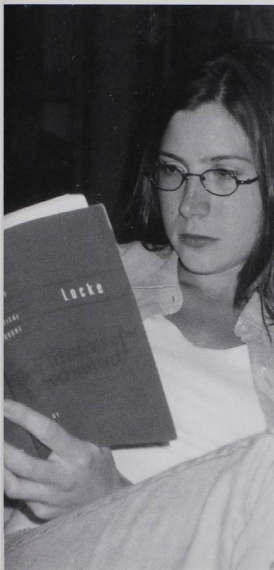

RETURNING STRONG

The Bearcat softball team put together the best season in team history last year with a 25-10 record. That was a sixteen game improvement from the 1999 team which finished at 11-28. The sixteen game improvement was the largest gain of any Division III program. The team also recorded a school record for wins and were ranked 5th in the final NCAA Division III West Region poll. The team also finished tied for second in the Northwest Conference with a record of 15-6.

A year later the 2001 Bearcat softball team is looking to improve on last years results and has good reason to be optimistic. Most of the infield will be intact with shortstop Maria Ortiz, second baseman Sheri Mabie and first baseman Meaghan Sussman all returning. Hayley Boston who led Willamette to a No. 1 ranking in NCAA Division III team ERA of 0.76 also returns this year. With the addition of six freshmen the team is ready to make another strong run.

That opportunity came early during March 9. The Bearcats were invited to play in the Division III NFCA

Leadoff Classic. Only the top twenty four teams in the nation are invited to this tournament. At the tournament the Bearcats went 2-4 with two losses that went into extra innings. The finish put the Bearcats at twelfth in the nation, and now the looking to improve upon that and all of last years accomplishments as they start the conference season.

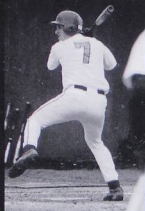

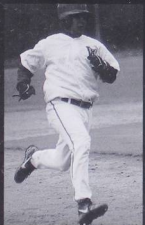

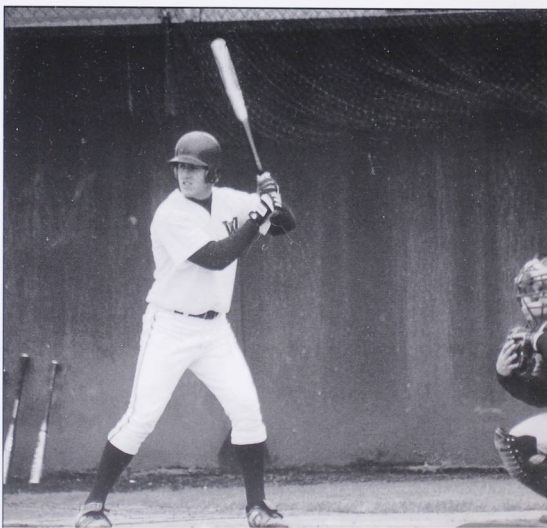

SEASON FAVORITES

The Willamette men's baseball team returns two thirds of last years starters and has high hopes for this year. They aren't the only one's planning a successful season, the pre-season Northwest Conference Coache's Poll picked them to finish first in the conference. Leading this year's team is last year's conference player of the year Nik Lubisich and other major league prospects Matt Benjamin and Andrew Ecklund.

With all the high expectations things got off to a rough start for the Bearcats. They opened the season against Northwest Nazarene College and

split a double header, but were then swept by Division II foe Western Oregon. By the beginning of Spring Break the Bearcats had run their record to 1-2 in conference play and 2-5 overall. That is when things started to change.

For spring break the team traveled down to California playing in many games, including the California Invitaional. Over this stretch the team went 9-1, winning the California Invitational in the process. In the tournament Nik Lubisich played well enough to earn NWC hitter of the week with a batting average of .556. Honorable mentions went to Nik Lubisich for pitcher of the week with fourteen strikeouts and to Danny Aguilar for hitting 10/22 with four doubles and six runs scored. To cap off the week the team returned home and swept George Fox, the defending conference champions. The Bearcats are now in form and looking to capture the conference title.

After a rainout against Pacific, however, the team has bounced back. They won both of their next two matches against Lewis and Clark and George Fox, both with a score of 7-0.

The women's tennis team hasn't fared much better this season. Going into the season they knew it wasn't going to be easy with only one senior, Jessie Hughes on their team. The season started out with a six game losing streak including four

conference losses that put them in the hole early. The Bearcats won two of their next three games against Seattle and George Fox by scores of 5-4 and 6-3. Since then the Bearcats have been unable to find their winning form again losing their next six matches.

Despite a disappointing season both teams are hoping for a strong showing in the conference tournament.

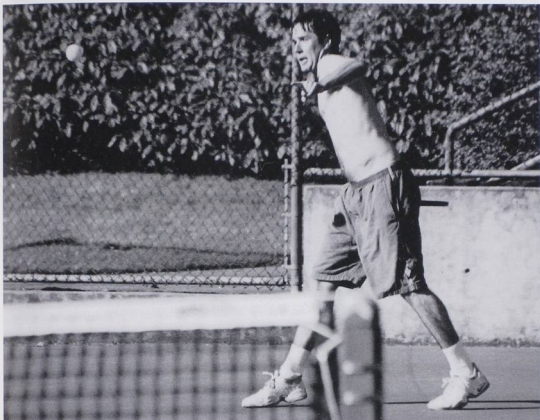

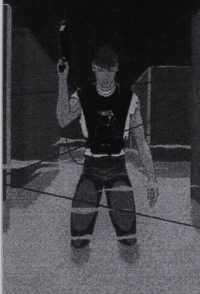
