

### The Most Spirited of Ways-






### When winning Is not enough...

The mens teams get off the line strong. freshmen Aaron Young and Jacob Stout. "It was an exciting year which proves to be promising for next" stated Jacob.





Once again expectations ran high for the Bearcat Women's soccer team. As head coach Jim Tursi explains, 'Coming into the season we expected to qualify for the NCAA tournament.' Coach Tursi's expectations came true when the Bearcat women advanced to the playoffs after receiving an at large bid. After a first round bye Willamette hosted the second and third round playoff games. The first game was against a tough Cal Lutheran who played well before Junior forward Buffy Morris scored two goals to lead the team to a 2-0 victory. The next day in a re-match against Chapman, who



they had tied earlier in the season, and in front of a large home crowd the Bearcats again found a way to win. Both teams battled well into the second half until Freshman Anne Merten scored the winning goal with just under two minutes to play. The season ended the following week with a loss against Trinity , but overall it was a strong playoff run. To get into the playoffs the Bearcats had another great season finsihing 19-3-1. First team nominees Morris and Merten at forward led the league's best offense along with Senior midfielder Dana Christopherson and speedy Senior winger Jenny Bellone.

> The league's best defense was anchored by two second team all league nominations. Junior sweeper Karen Heaston and Senior marking back Erin Moore. The Bearcats will miss the four senior cocaptains next year, Bellone, Christopherson, Moore and Jenny Frankel-Reed, but will look to make another run into the playoffs.





### INFIRMARY REPORT

The Bearcat football came into the season with high expectations as defending Conference Champions. However, this was not to be Willamette's year. The injuries and illnesses hit early, often and unexpectedly. Of the twentytwo starters on offense and defense only seven started in all ten games. As Coach Speckman commented. Twe never seen anything like that.' With the toughest schedule of any team in the Conference, including three teams ranked in the top ten, the Bearcats were unable to overcome all of the setbacks. When the team was healthy it showed what kind of season it might have been. In the season opener they beat Chapman University 32-20 on the road. 
Next year the Bearcats look to return to their winning ways with so many players getting a chance to play this season.

Here they come. As you may have noticed the new sport on campus this year is men's lacrosse. Normally thought of as an East Coast sport, lacrosse is starting to make its way westward. What started out as only a few guys practicing at the beginning of the year turned into a full fledged team by the spring semester. The team will play in the second division of the Pacific Northwest Collegiate Lacrosse League. The other teams in their division are Oregon State, Puget Sound, Linfield and Gonzaga. They will play each of these teams twice during the season followed by a postseason tournament.

The game of lacrosse is a combination of hockey and basketball played on a soccer field. The players wear shoulder pads, use a small rubber ball the size of a baseball and have a stick to catch and throw the ball. The field is roughly 110 x 70 yards and each team has ten players on the field including a goalie. Fouls committed by players such as slashing are penalized by a power play for the other team, similar to hockey.

# PLAYOFF BOUND

The Bearcats topped off a strong season with a berth in the three team NWC playoffs. They played PLU on the road and hung close at half time only down by seven. Early in the second half they took the lead at 37-36 before PLU went on a 13-1 run that finished off the Bearcats and a strong season.

Willamette started off the pre-season strong by going 4-1 and winning the Colorado College Thanksgiving Invitational. The momentum carried the team into the regular season where they won their first two games against Puget Sound and Linfield. After dropping their next four

games the Bearcats won nine of their next ten games before they faced the number one ranked team in the nation, George Fox. Playing without the Conference's leading scorer Kelly Sorenson, the Bearcats found a way to keep the game close and were tied at 52 with just over four minutes remaining. The Bearcats then went on a seven point run to lead 59-52 with just under two minutes




That opportunity came early during March 9. The Bearcats were invited to play in the Division III NFCA


