The object of the Young Womens' Christian Association, in its broadest sense, is: To help girls develop intellectually, physically, and spiritually. Some of the aims of the work are: To promote Bible study. The policy of that Committee is—Every Willamette girl a Bible student.

To promote Mission Study—The Missions is more broadening and enlightening and more practical and up-to-date than any one study on the College cur-

riculum.

The Membership Committee's policy is: Every Willamette girl an Association girl and every Association girl a Christian. Every girl in sympathy with Christian work is especially invited to become a member. Fees are \$1 per year.

The Social Committee gives the afternoon receptions at the beginning of the year, where all the girls form new acquaintances and renew old ones. Many other social events are given by this Department during the year.

Please attend the Northwest Conference, which is held for ten days, the last of June, on the seacoast. Splendid accommodations, low rates, fine speak-

ers, and an inspiration for you.

Meetings of the Y. W. C. A. are held Sunday afternoon at 3 o'clock. Watch the bulletin board for poster announcing these meetings.

The Ladies' Glee Club.

Although this organization was formed only the first of December, 1908, it has made wonderful progress. It is composed of twenty four young ladies, from all departments of the University. The Club is under the instruction of Dean Mendenhall, of the Conservatory of Music, and meets once a week for practice under his supervision. Last year it appeared before the public several times with marked success. this year, with more training and experience, it will be more popular than ever. We expect to make this the most successful Ladies' Glee Club of the State this year, so let every girl in the University who sings be on hand to try out for membership to this organization.

The Philodosian Society.

The Philodosian Society is the oldest literary organization in the University for young women. Its aim is high, having to do, primarily, with intellectual growth and fluency and accuracy of speech. It has a literary program at each weekly meeting, and these are interesting and entertaining. Social culture is sought by instruction from competent leaders, and in the social events which are given by the Society during the year. This Society has elegantly furnished halls on the third floor of the old college building, which are open unto those of its brother society, the Philodorian.

Adelante Society for College Girls

is the youngest and one of the most progressive of the Societies. Its differential feature is that its members are required to be college students. It has also a junior membership, made up of academy students, who become eligible to senior membership on entering college. The work done in the past year was of high order and great value, in both, literary lines and debate. Last June the Adelante representative won the trophy given at the Annual Inter-Society Oratorical Contest.

[Extract from the Constitution.]			

Article II-Object.

The object of this Association shall be to promote growth in Grace and Christian fellowship among its members, and aggressive Christian work, especially by and for students, totrain them to devote their lives to Jesus Christ, not only in distinctively religious callings, but also in secular pursuits.

Article III-Membership.

Sec. 1. The active membership of the Association shall consist of men, either students or members of the faculty, of this institution, who are members in good standing of some evangelical church, and have been elected by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any meeting. Only active members shall vote and hold office.

Sec. 2. Any man of good moral character, either student or member of the faculty of this institution, may become an associate member by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any meeting.

The membership fee shall be \$1 per year, payable at the opening of the col-

lege year.

Sec. 4. It shall be the duty of each member to co-operate heartily in carrying out the objects of the Association in Article II, according to the policy determined by the Association or Executive Committee.

Statement.

The Young Men's Christian Association of Willamette University stands for the best there is in college life. It is the strongest organization in college, including among its members the strongest men, both in athletics and scholarship. A cordial invitation is extended to every man in the University to ally himself with the Association, either as an active or associate member.

Bible Study.

Recognizing the fact that no man is truly educated without a thorough knowledge of the Bible; that its systematic study is almost indispensible to a powerful Christian life; and that few men will keep up this study alone, we have organized Bible study classes. During the past year three courses have been

offered. Each one is arranged for about twenty minutes daily study, and meets once a week for fellowship helps and for consideration of the past week's study.

Missions.

This Association endeavors to stimulate an intelligent interest in the Missionary movement, by means of its Mission Study Classes. One or more courses will be offered this year.

Missionary meetings are held each month on live and practical phases of the work, often in conjunction with the

Y. W. C. A.

The Student Volunteer Band.

This organization is closely allied to the Missionary department, and is composed of students who have definitely signified their intentions to become foreign missionaries, if the Lord permits. Last year we had ten members in our Volunteer Band.

The Student Body

is the organization of the students of all departments of the University, and controls all student enterprises. Every student who desires to participate in athletics, debate or oratory, MUST join this organization. The success of all student enterprises depends upon the interest which each individual student manifests in college affairs. A fee of \$3\$ is charged to defray the expenses of the student body.

Conventions and Conferences,

State Y. M. C. A. Convention—The Oregon-Idaho State Convention is held every year at one of the City Association or college towns, and is a source of inspiration and help to all who attend.

Pacific Northwest Conference.

The greatest event in a Y. M. C. A. man's life is the Summer Conference, held in June, at Columbia Beach, Wash. To go apart, for a period of ten days, in the company of the best and strongest men of the colleges of the Northwest is a privilege which no college man can afford to miss. We want you to go this Spring.

Student's Handbook.

The Handbook is issued every year by the Christian Associations, and distributed free of charge to all students. The purpose of this little publication is to give general information concerning school life, which we hope will help you over some of the rough places.



































































COLLEGE ORGANIZATIONS.

Oratorical Association.

The State Oratorical Association is composed of local associations from the following Colleges and Universities: O. A. C., at Corvallis; Pacific College, at Newberg; McMinnville College, at Mc-Minnville: Albany College, at Albany; O. S. N. S., at Monmouth; University of Oregon, at Eugene; Pacific University, at Forest Grove; and Willamette University, at Salem. The State contest is held the second Friday of March of each year, the place alternating among the different schools represented. Wiliamette is to have the important event next year. Of late honors have fallen to no school twice in succession. Mr. Jones, of the Albany College, was the successful contestant in 1906; Miss of Pacific College, in 1907; Mr. Prescott, of U. of O., 1908; and last Spring the trophy was rescued by Clark Russel Belknap for Old Willamette. The successful contestant receives a beautiful gold medal, as a partial reward for his This is the first time for several years that these signal honors have graced our Institution. But "Having once attained these utmost heights, and gratified with the enviable record achieved-for we have secured a good rank-in every contest in which we have been represented for several years back, "we press forward unto the things that are before" with pride in the past, and with most sanguine promises for the future.

Debates.

Considering the difficulties under which they labored, the Willamette Debating Teams of the past year did remarkably well. Willamette has good, workable talent in the debating line, and is particularly fortunate in having a place in the Triangular League, together with Whitman College and Pacific University. It is to be hoped that the new school year will find Willamette with a recognized Department of Debate, with a recognized head of such a department, as well as a competent coach.

Websterian Society.

About thirty young men of the school have membership in the Websterian Literary Society. Although a Society of recent organization, the work done is of great merit. Debate is made the principal feature of the work, and many of the names of those who have so creditably represented Willamette in debate will be found on the enrollment of this Society.
