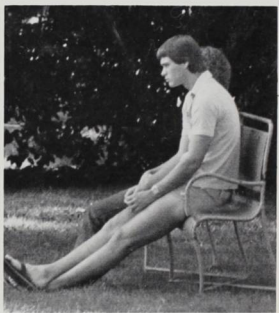

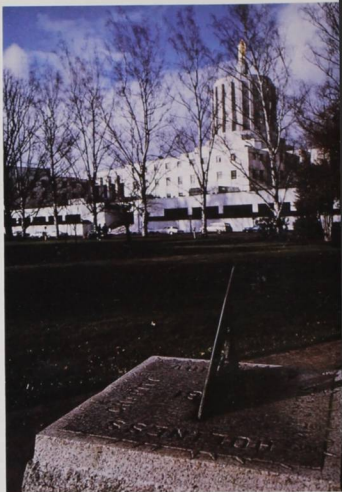


In composing a song, many individuals must combine their talents and work together to create. Willamette students work in much the same way, in an attempt to expand not only their own experiences but those of others too.

The Bearcat (our JV) team had an excellent season- defeating Pacific twice and Lewis and Clark while losing to

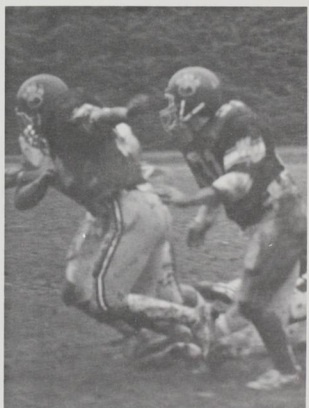
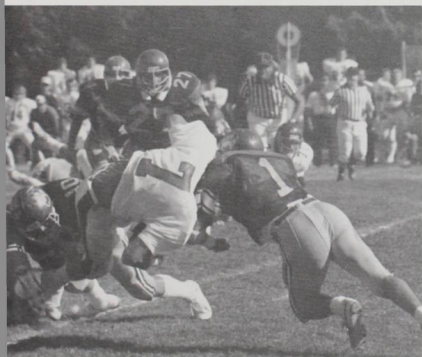
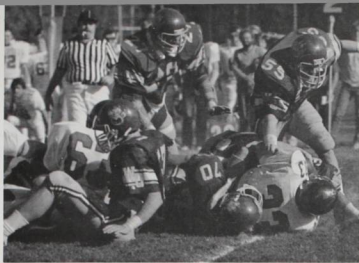

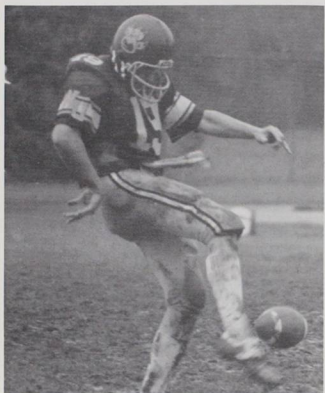
WOSC and Linfield. Both losses were close and the experience each athlete gained was invaluable.
