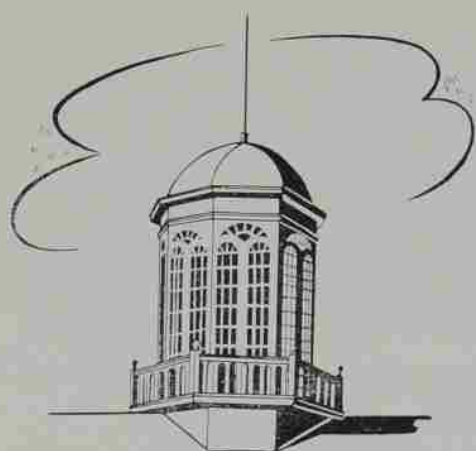

From the Tower

NEW DEAN



President G. Herbert Smith has announced the appointment of Miss Dell C. Chenoweth to the position of Dean of Women at Willamette. Miss Chenoweth comes to Willamette from Stanford University, where she has completed her residence for her Doctor's degree and where she has been administrative head of the Residence Program and advisor to the Associated Women Students. From 1953 to 1955 she served as Student Dean at Syracuse University and from 1955 to 1959 was director of the Residence Hall Program at Northern Illinois University. She has acted as counsellor in public schools at DeKalb, Illinois.

At Willamette Dean Chenoweth succeeds Mrs. Regina L. Ewalt who has served as Dean of Women since 1948. Mrs. Ewalt had worked previously for the YWCA and at Stephens College in Missouri. She did graduate work in psychology at Columbia University. During Mrs. Ewalt's service at Willamette the women's enrollment has expanded from 371 to 446, housing facilities for women have increased by three new dormitories and the sorority roll has increased from four to five.

C OF C COMMITTEE MEMBER

Mr. Richard Wagner, President of the U. S. Chamber of Commerce has asked Dean Robert D. Gregg to serve as a member of the American Delegation of the U. S. Chamber of Commerce U. S.-Mexican Committee. For two reasons the committee is most important. One, it examines relationships between the two countries and recommends to the U. S. Chamber business policies between the two countries. Secondly, the present struggle against Castroism and Communism in Mexico makes the activities and the presence of the committee particularly important. The first meeting of the committee will be held this fall in the city of Cuernavaca and later this winter a second meeting will be held, probably in Washington, D. C.

CAMPUS ADDITION?

The City of Salem is considering as the initial effort of a proposed urban renewal project the purchase and razing of an eight-block area around the Willamette University campus. Under the program, land would be purchased from its owners or acquired at condemnation proceedings. The buildings and improvements would be leveled and the land would be resold to the University at bare land prices.

The land affected lies generally between 12th Street and the alley east of Winter Street S.E., and the Southern Pacific Trade Street spur and Shelton Ditch. It would be used as an extension of the university campus, which has been described to the Salem City Council by President Smith as already cramped.

It is hoped that in the fall issue of the *Alumnus* an approved and planned urban renewal project affecting the future of Willamette's expansion program can be reported.

NEW UNIFORMS

The striking new uniforms worn by the Willamette University band have been designed for multiple use and maximum effectiveness. The black and white uniform as shown here worn by Ray Krueger, student assistant in the band department, is enlivened by gold braid trim, scarlet and gold emblem, white leggings and bright red cockade plume



in the cap. The uniform is worn in this fashion when the band performs as a marching unit, but for concerts, the leggings, plume and white front overlay are removed, and the uniform looks much like a tuxedo. The university is justly proud of the splendid appearance and fine performance of its 50-member band.

IN HOC ANNO DOMINI

The following excerpts from the Commencement Address by Tyrone Gillespie are herewith presented in answer to the many requests from those who were unable to attend this year's ceremonies.

President Smith, Revered Faculty,
Honored Seniors, Parents and Friends:

This is the year of Our Lord 1961. This day of this year is a day set aside to honor our graduating Seniors, and I am confident that this day and this year will be abidingly cherished in the memories of our graduates, their parents, and friends.

Will you forgive me, Seniors, if I address my remarks for a moment to the faculty? The words that I would direct to them I know are in your hearts, but at this moment they are difficult for you to say.

Honored Faculty, yours is a noble profession. Cicero extolled as the noblest employment of man the instruction of the rising generation. The greatest man that ever lived was a teacher. You can testify that compensation in worldly tender for the devotion, the service, the dedication, the selflessness and the friendship which you have laid upon the altar, has been small. But you can accept with assurance that your learning and sacrifice have created an influence for good which has moved horizontally to the far corners of the earth and will extend vertically through generations yet unborn. Many of you have built a rich memorial in the hearts of your students more to be prized than jewels or gold or statues of bronze or stone. For this graduating class and for the classes of the past who have partaken of your wisdom, I express a profound thanks and an abiding gratefulness too full for adequate expression.

Parents, I would be advocate for this Senior Class to express a sentiment to you. Dr. William Moran, President of Colorado State University, facetiously remarked, upon occasion of a Commencement address, that "Almost nobody listens to a Commencement address except perhaps a few parents engaged in one last effort to get something for their money." You know, and I know, and he knew that this remark was facetious, for today you are witnessing the culmination of many hours of hope, love, devotion, perhaps some anxiety and in some cases, sacrifice. The pride you now feel is your reward, but deep in the hearts of these fine young men and women lies

an unexpressed obligation to you for the part you have played in making today become a reality. This feeling may not be verbalized but it is present, poignant, and abiding. Admixed with the emotions of this day are sentiments of gratitude to you.

It is obvious that the pace and momentum of technological progress is rapidly accelerating.

Five thousand years passed between man's discovery of the wheel and the invention of the steam engine. It was 140 years from the invention of the steam engine to the development of the airplane. It was 40 years from the airplane to the atom bomb. It was only 12 years from the atom bomb to Sputnik. This year, only four years from Sputnik, the first man was launched into space.

This suggests that the world in which you are to live and achieve will be a very different world, and soon. Its limitations are only the limitations of the imagination of the most fertile mind. We can with money and effort today approximate almost anything we can dream. I say "approximate," for while you can dream of a flying carpet and this may not be a reality, you even now can ride a flying saucer or a flying bathtub.

Ninety percent of all the scientists who ever lived are alive today.

At the turn of the century the average work week was 60 hours in length. Since that date the work week has shortened in manufacturing industries at a steady rate. In the years 1900 to 1930 the work week dropped from 60 to 50 hours. In the years 1930 to 1950 it dropped from 50 to 40 hours. In the meantime, productivity rose, and is still rising, at about an average of 2.4 per cent per year.

This indicates that in all likelihood during your working years—in fact in the next 20 years—the standard work week will be 24 hours.

Are we prepared for the amount of leisure we will enjoy? Will the amount of leisure time cause a restlessness in our people which will be reflected in increased crime, inebriation, immorality, mental disturbance and insanity? This has been an experience of the past. There is an Arabian proverb which says, "An idle person is the devil's playfellow."

Rooted in the long past is an urge to construct, to create, and a need to invest one's self in work. In times of unemployment or idleness, the ratio of crime and neurotic behavior soars.

There is an antidote, there is an answer to this problem. Whether you know it or not, you have found it here at Willamette. Jesus said it simply: "Whoever loses his life for my sake shall save it." You have found in this place some cause, some creed, some worthwhile goal in which you can lose yourself, which will provide you with that objective passion which will bring maturity and the ability to live outside yourself and for the good of mankind.

Along with a prodigality of leisure, there travels a dangerous partner: the evil of materialism. This is evidenced in too many universities which teach how to make a living, but not how to live. It is evidenced in a society which will willingly trade personal responsibility and independence for security. It is evidenced in a worship for science without morality. A nuclear blast has no moral sense to restrain it *from* evil or direct it *for* good if the hand that controls it has no such discrimination. Materialistic politicalization of an increasing portion of our lives is destructive of that needed sense of personal responsibility, initiative and independence, and restrictive of freedom.

It is with gratification we note that many modern youths are rebelling against the hypocrisy of compulsive and degrading political subsidy and are seeking the free, voluntary, independent, mature approach for solving the needs of their personal lives, and the selective compassionate approach to assistance to their fellow man. They are assured by instinct that only in this way will that psychic hunger which cannot be satisfied with bread be assuaged.

They are seeking a dominant faith to which to attach their philosophy of life. Have you had opportunity to hear a speech contest lately where young people have their choice of subject matter? You will be amazed at the number who speak on religious and spiritual subjects in a manner which indicates deep-seated thought and reflection. Your encouragement of these instincts toward independence, dignity, self-reliance and soul satisfaction will certainly bring closer the closing of the gap between our philosophical future and our technological future, to the betterment of both.

You, and each of you, are technologically greater than any machine ever made, and you will adapt and adjust

Dear Friends:



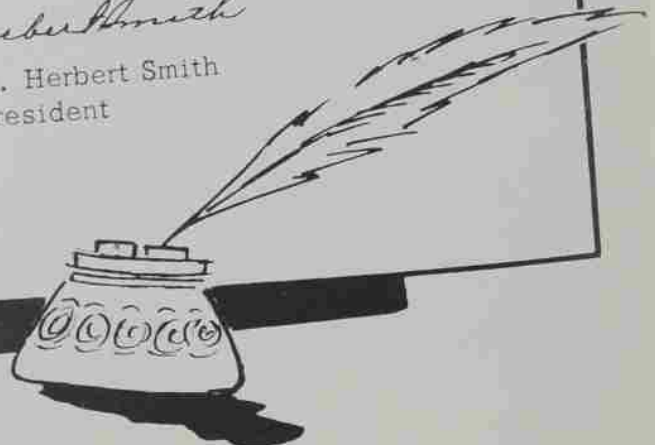
As you plan your annual budget of giving, we ask that you include your Alma Mater -- and if possible increase the amount to help us meet the increased commitments of the University.

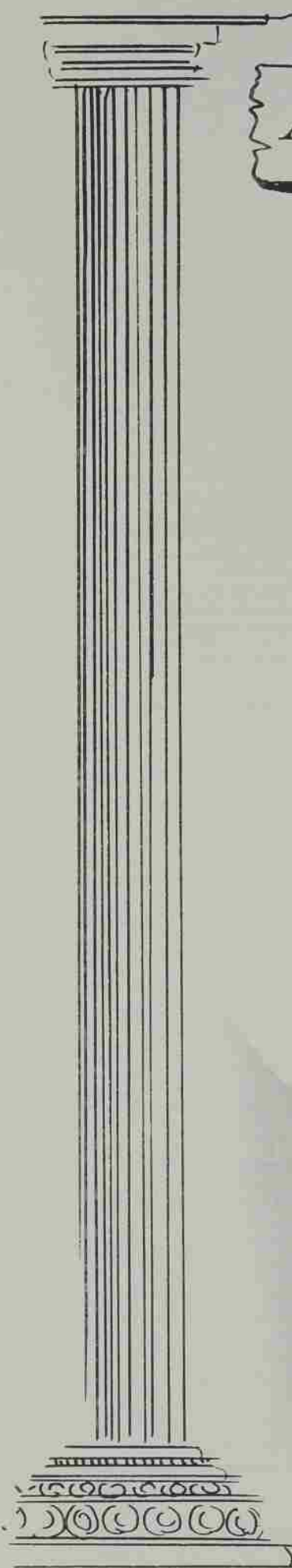

"LABOR OF LOVE"



The first copy of a revised edition of Dr. Morton E. Peck's "Manual of the Higher Plants of Oregon" came off the press in time for the Willamette commencement.

It was a propitious time, because Mrs. Jessie J. Peck, the widow and for many years the scientific collaborator of Willamette's noted botanist, was able to exhibit the volume at a tea she gave at her home for almost thirty members of the "Blacksheep" class of 1921. Members of this class for a good many years have made an annual contribution to the Peck Herbarium Fund.

Dr. Peck's manual was published originally in 1941 by Binford-Mort of Portland.

Almost immediately Dr. Peck started the enormous task of revision — a task which held him enthralled during his twilight years when many another would have sought only rest and relaxation after a productive life. Completion of this manuscript would have represented a

monumental accomplishment for a man in vigorous health. For Professor Peck, who was known and loved for his quiet gentleness, it was an incredible triumph over devastating illness and infirmity. He literally seemed to be holding death at bay until he could write "Finis" to his completed manuscript. It was also "Finis" to a distinguished career as Oregon's outstanding botanist and as a beloved member of the faculty of Willamette University.

In all this labor, Dr. Peck received and repeatedly acknowledged the invaluable assistance given by his wife. During his lifetime, they were a joyous team, exploring the hills and fields of Oregon for new specimens, tirelessly engaging in thorough research to insure the highest degree of scientific accuracy for their work, laboring in laboratory and classroom with generations of students; and after retirement, in building, organizing and maintaining the Herbarium which is today one of Willamette's most treasured assets.

After the death of Dr. Peck, it was Mrs. Peck who continued the still enormous task of preparing the manuscript for publication, checking for errors, and proof-reading. Gratefully, she acknowledged the services of members of the staff of Oregon State University, who sponsored publication of the manual. In particular, outstanding contributions were made by Dr. Helen M. Gilkey, Miss LaRea J. Dennis, W.U. '57, and Dr. Roy A. Young.

Now that the new edition of the "Manual of the Higher Plants of Oregon" is off the press, Mrs. Peck continues to work in the Herbarium, which is housed in Collins Hall. The present generation of college students may see her about the campus, never guessing what years of assistance she has given to her husband and their work, to the students, to the University, and to the advancement of science in the State of Oregon.

At their class luncheon, the members of the Class of 1921 were happy to salute Mrs. Peck who has long been considered, informally at least, an honorary member of the class, and to pay a generous tribute of affection to one of Willamette's most gracious ladies.
