

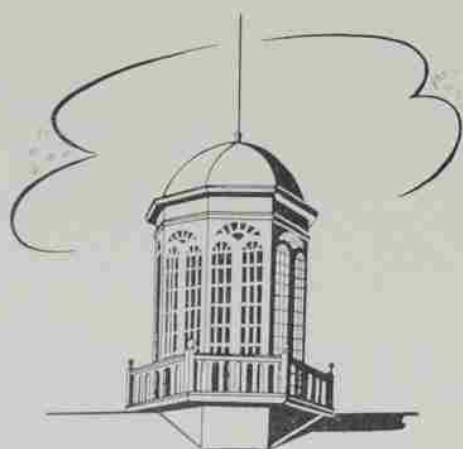

AFROTC Courses Cut

The Willamette AFROTC requirement for freshmen and sophomores will be reduced to four hours of air science beginning next fall; it was decided in a recent faculty meeting. Courses that the ROTC department would prefer first semester freshmen to take are generally the same as those required by Willamette for liberal arts graduation. Second semester they will be required to study the regular air science course taught, covering, in one semester, the subject matter now taught in the freshman year.

First semester sophomores will study a compressed version of the air science curriculum again covering the material now taught in one year. Second semester they will study material that will apply to their underdivision requirements.

That institution, fondly known among the members of the ROTC detachment as leadership laboratory, will continue unchanged throughout the two year program.

This change, the first major one in the curriculum since the detachment first came to Willamette in 1951, will allow the underdivision men 12 hours outside their lower division requirements. This leaves them lagging only 4 hours behind the women students who have 16 hours. One other obvious change has taken place in the ROTC program since its original conception. This change was the exemption of the reservists from the program 2 years ago. Stimulated by two letters to the editor of the *Collegian* the faculty dropped the ROTC requirement for those in the reserve program in February, 1958.

The change was enacted as part of a nationwide program to provide more air force personnel for the missile pinch. "Expecting the nationwide enrollment of incoming freshman males to double within the next ten years, the Air Force is taking this step in order to cut the required number of AFROTC staff members," stated Major Walter Fagan.

Awards Won

Twenty-three graduating seniors have won some form of financial aid at graduate schools around the country to assist them in advanced work.

Departments winning the most awards were physics and chemistry with four each. Economics with three was top among the social sciences.

Winning awards in chemistry were Ted Cook, Grants Pass, freshman scholarship to the Baylor College of Medicine; John Kaufman, Chehalis, Wash., teaching assistantship, Oregon State College; William Randall, Cottage Grove, teaching assistantship, University of Illinois; Ronald Walker, Vancouver, Wash., freshman scholarship, Baylor College of Medicine.

Awards in physics went to Dale Denham, Portland, Atomic Energy Commission fellowship to the University of Washington; Fum Duncan, Tucson, Ariz., AEC fellowship to the University of Washington; Mildred Edmundson, Hood River, AEC fellowship to Vanderbilt University; and Keith Pailthorp, Milwaukie, AEC fellowship to the University of Washington.

Winning grants in economics were Charles Beaton, Salem, National Defense fellowship to Claremont Graduate School; John Galbraith, graduate assistantship, University of Washington; and James Lewis, graduate scholarship, Claremont graduate school.

Other awards include Robert Bennett, Seattle, National Defense fellowship in English to the University of Pennsylvania; Larry Chandos, Salem, National Defense fellowship in history to Duke University; Leslie Edwards, Moro, graduate assistantship, University of Oregon; Joan Griffis, Portland, California P.T.A. scholarship in education to the University of California.

Lawrence Hobson, Gooding, Idaho, graduate assistantship in psychology to Ohio University; Edward Huggins, Salem, National Defense fellowship in English to the University of Oregon; Patricia Mitzel, Portland, National Defense fellowship in Romance languages to the University of Oregon; Margaret Neiman, Salem, graduate assistantship in Spanish

to the University of Oregon; Barbara Pfaff, Portland, scholarship in sociology to Western Reserve; William Schantz, Salem, Ford Foundation fellowship in law to New York University; Douglas Wallis, Silverton, graduate assistantship in mathematics to Case Institute of Technology; and Terry Kent, Portland, a psychology major, a scholarship to the Boston University School of Theology.

For many years he has had a weekly, 30-minute TV program, and in this capacity especially has gained for himself the title, "Voice of Protestantism." He is recognized as an outstanding clergyman and theological thinker and is known as one of the "greats" in Christendom today.

Summer Travelers

Many faculty members are away this summer and many of the trips they are taking are both interesting and profitable. Dr. Cameron Paulin of the art department is spending the summer in Japan studying Oriental Art. Dr. and Mrs. Reginald Parker from the College of Law are in Vienna this summer on a Ford Foundation grant making a comparative study of Austrian administrative procedure and its possibilities applicable in the United States. Mrs. Parker, who is a former attorney in Austria, is assisting Dr. Parker in the study.

Dr. Paul Trueblood, '28, of the English department and his wife spent two weeks of the summer in Springfield, Mass., as members of a conference and seminar under the Iota Sigma organization which administers the Sharman Trust devoted to study of religious issues at the college level. Members of the seminar were either former teachers or students in this program. Professor and Mrs. Herman Clark, '14, Dr. and Mrs. Howard Teeple, '38, and Mr. and Mrs. Ray Short, '44, were other Willamette alumni and former students who took part in the conference. Dr. Glenn Olds, '42, is now president of Springfield College.

From the chemistry department, Dr. Paul Duell is spending most of the summer at Kansas State College on a National Science Foundation Teaching fellowship. Dr. Marion Morange from the language department is spending her

summer in France and Dr. and Mrs. Daniel Schulze are also in Europe. The Schulzes, however, are spending most of their summer in Germany and plan to attend the Passion Play in Bavaria.

Russian Added

The faculty has approved a major in Russian to be added to the curriculum within the next two to five years. According to Registrar Richard Yocom and University President Dr. G. Herbert Smith, this will depend on demand and on the acquisition of adequate library facilities, which will be accumulated prior to the addition of a particular course, and an instructor of Russian history.

The new major will correspond to other foreign language majors in requirements with language, literature, history, and political science courses, plus an art survey course, required. The first course of the new program, which will be offered this fall, is "Composition and Conversation," devoted to reading and discussion in Russian of modern Russian texts. It will include exercises in composition and syntax, according to Russian instructor Miss Udrie.

The addition of the new courses will give a more detailed study of Russian prose and poetry and scientific Russian than is offered at present and will give students the opportunity to gain wider experience in conversation and oral expression.

Sociology head, Dr. John Rademaker, states that two new sociology courses will be offered this fall. "Psycho-Dynamics of Family Adjustment" is a 400 seminar course offering student observation, research, and discussion of current theories of personal and social adjustment within the family and will be taught by A. E. Gravatt.

The second course, "American Indians of the Pacific Northwest," is to be a study of the Indians of Oregon, Washington, British Columbia, and Alaska taught by Dr. Rademaker as a 300 course. It will encompass a study of the Indian's culture, of the modification of this culture through the intrusion of the Euro-American culture, and of the modifications of the people to the new society of immigrants. Offered this fall and requiring two museum trips or their equivalent throughout the semester, the student may follow it with "Ethnic and Cultural Backgrounds and Relationships" in the spring.

Collegian Tops

For the third consecutive semester the fall semester Willamette *Collegian* took top honors in judging of college newspapers by capturing the coveted "All-American" rating. Judging is done by the Associated Collegiate Press, a college newspaper clinic of the University of Minnesota.

Gaining 3410 out of a possible total of 3700 points, the *Collegian* entered the ranks of the upper 10 per cent of the nation's college newspapers, as judged by the ACP. The award was received by 6 college papers out of a possible 63 entered in the 751 to 1250 school enrollment category.

Some 56 newspapers throughout the nation received the award in all categories, judging from a total of 493 papers entered.

Judging takes into consideration comprehensiveness and balance of news and creativeness of news treatment, treatment of copy, style, type of lead, edicoverage, makeup of all pages, headlines, typography and photography.

Points are awarded in poor, weak, fair, good, very good, excellent and superior categories along a graded scale. All *Collegian* ratings were very good or better. The rating was made only on the basis of a comparison with other papers in the 751 to 1250 enrollment category.

The high award was earned both semesters last year under editor-in-chief Carol McMinimie. Though the *Collegian* has not missed a first class rating in preceding recent years, the last All-American rating before last year was under the 1954-55 editorship of Chuck Ruud, presently Willamette's publicity director.

"COACH OF THE YEAR"

Coach John Lewis received a singular honor in May when he was named "Coach of the Year" by District 2 of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics.

The district embraces all Oregon colleges and universities in the Northwest Conference and the Oregon Collegiate conference. Lewis was the first district coach ever selected for the newly-created award.

Lewis' accomplishments during the past school year included leading his basketball team to the NWC title and the NAIA district 2 title. The team won the right to represent the district at the NAIA national meet in Kansas City, Mo.

Lewis' earlier record over his 13 years at Willamette has been equally glowing. His baseball teams won conference pennants in 1953 and 1955 and a co-championship in 1950. His hoop squads have won four conference championships and three co-championships.

His coaching abilities were further recognized this summer when he was invited to return to the University of Oregon, his alma mater, where he conducted a baseball clinic.

'60 Football: What's Ahead?

21 Lettermen, 2 Little All-Americans Will Bolster Fall Grid Fortunes

WILLAMETTE'S football coaches have been plotting the coming campaign with the precision of the Joint Chiefs of Staff pouring over a battle plan.

For Coach Ted Ogdahl and Line Coach Jerry Long, the 1960 season started the day after the Bearcats administered that 37-26 drubbing to Central Washington last November.

Since that time they have been exhorting their charges to stay in shape, interviewing new prospects, hatching intricate offensive and defensive maneuvers and viewing films.

Sunny summer afternoons are no time for outdoor frolic for Ogdahl and Long. They closet themselves with old game films and analyze them panel by panel. "In old films we've found individual or team weaknesses in opponents that have paid off later in the season," says Ogdahl. "For example, that first-play touchdown pass that Tommy Lee threw to Terry Kent against Lewis and Clark last year was plotted the previous summer."

With 29 gridders back from last year's championship squad, 21 of them lettermen, and Little All-Americans Stan Solomon and Marv Cisneros in camp, the coaches might be expected to display a ray of optimism about the coming grid season. But neither of them do. They point to the depth and experience conference rivals Lewis and Clark, Pacific and Whitman will have.

For Willamette, opponents can expect the Bearcats to throw an even more wide-open and varied offense this fall. Sophomore Tommy Lee, who completed over 40 percent of his passes last fall, will have a selection of receivers. Back at ends will be Lee Weaver and Larry Lynn, top pass catchers in 1958 and 1959 respectively. Two halfbacks, Stan Solomon and Kevin Nagel, leading ground gainers last season, will also be aerial targets.

Other leading prospects for the backfield are sophomore halfbacks Jiggs Burnett and Bob Bowman, junior reserve quarterback Keith Burres and hard-driving junior fullback Larry Miller. Added to these veterans will be Boise Junior College transfer Jim McCaffery, a 6-0, 195-pound halfback and fullback who played formerly at North Salem High School.

Opening holes for this group will be the Long line, "one of the heaviest in years." The vets weigh in like this: Jim Robinson, tackle, 210; Bill Hartman, center, 225; Don Green, tackle, 220; Larry Lynn, end, 205; Lee Weaver, end, 192; Doug Austin, guard, 190; Marv Cisneros, guard, 215; Stu Hall, linebacker, 190; and George Douglass, center, 200.

These reserves will also figure importantly in the Bearcats' two-platoon system: Dee Crooch, tackle, 215; Bob Wall, defensive back, 165; Rich Litchfield, defensive back, 180; Mark Gruelich, tackle, 205; Jim Hughes, guard, 185; and Ron Younger, guard, 180.

Right now the Bearcat mentors are planning ways to overcome what appears to be two chief squad weaknesses, defensive ends and safety. The graduation of Terry Kent and Bill Wall at ends and Dale Shumway and Jack Berkey from the defensive backfield left gaps that will be hard to fill. But if conscientious homework will find an answer, the Willamette coaches will have it when practice opens in September.

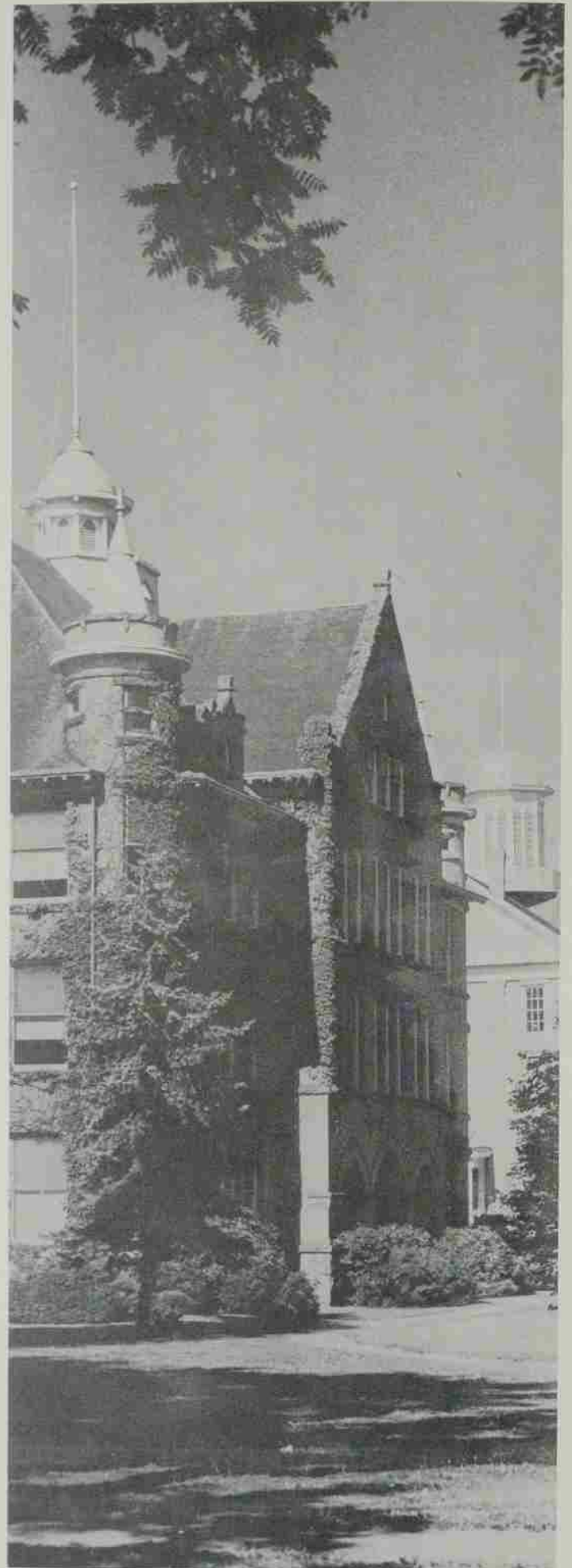
A UNIVERSITY

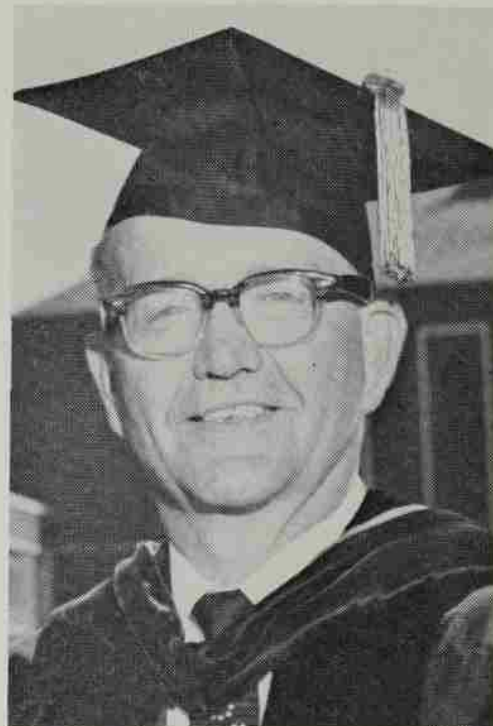

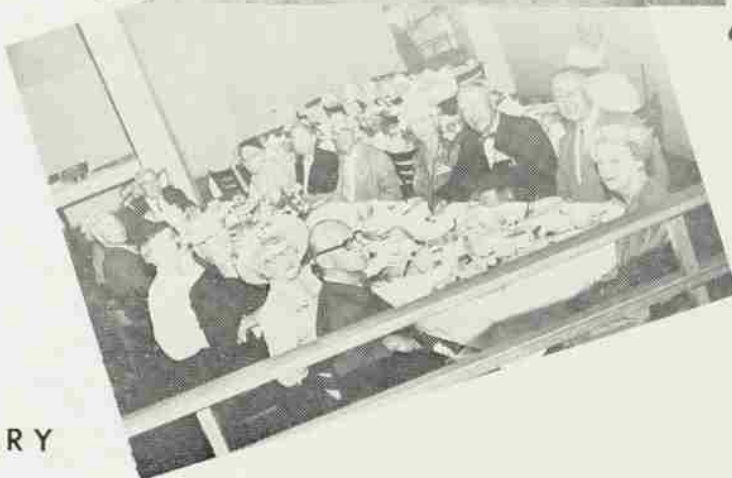
