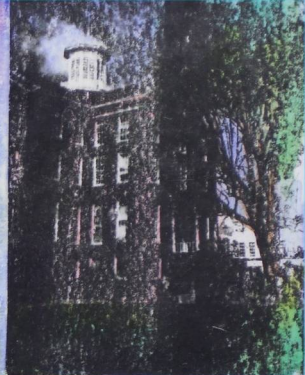
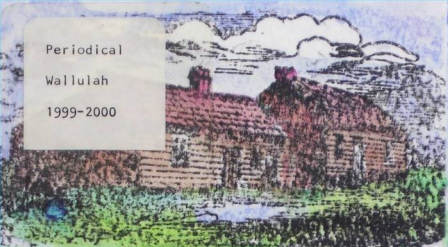


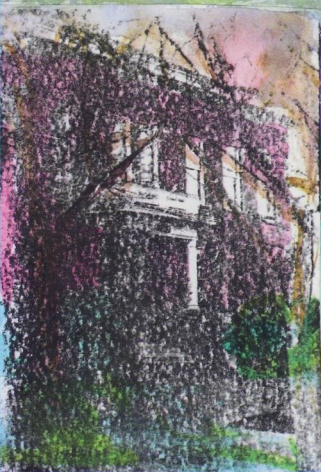

1962- The Columbus Day Storm ravaged campus leaving visible evidence behind that it wasn't all a dream.

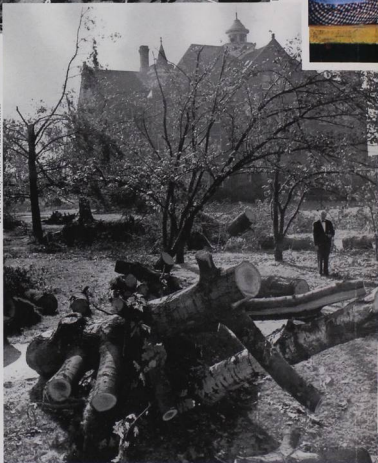

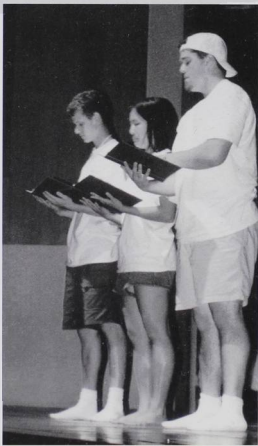

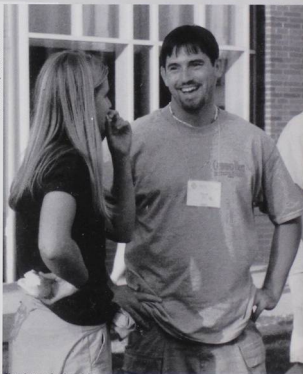

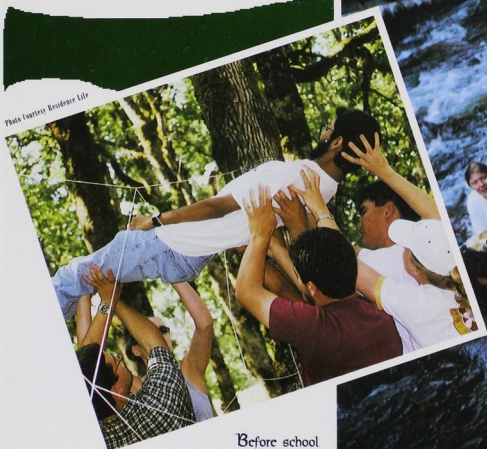

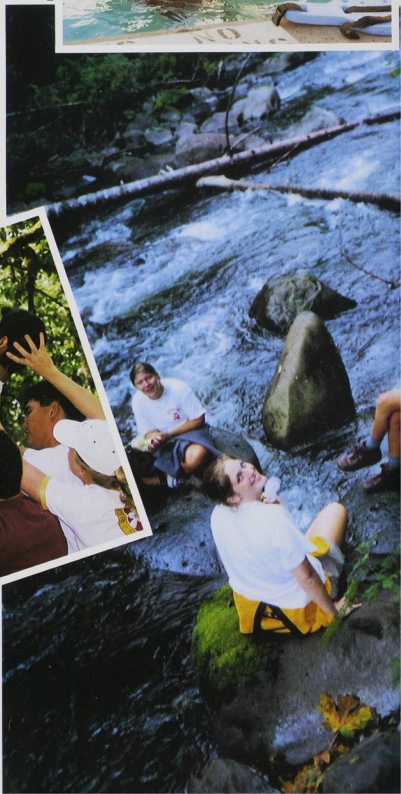

It was during this year that the President of Willamette, Carl G. Doney, and basketball manager, J. Read Bain, introduced the Bearcat as Willamette's first mascot, at a pep rally. The Bearcat's purpose was to increase student moral and promote Willamette's athletic teams.

In 1952 the Bearcat underwent its first change. The cat claws and tail disappeared, along with the rough image. The Bearcat put on a college sweater and received a name, "Barney". Barney cheered for Willamette sports for the next forty-seven years. It was finally retired in October 1999 but the bottom-heavy bear (pictured below) put up its best fight before hanging in its skin.

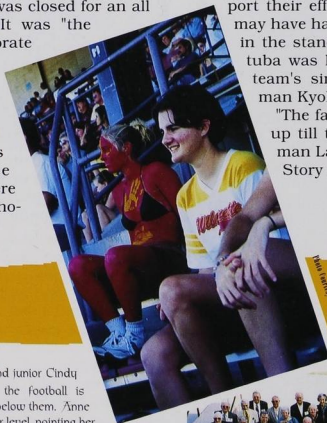

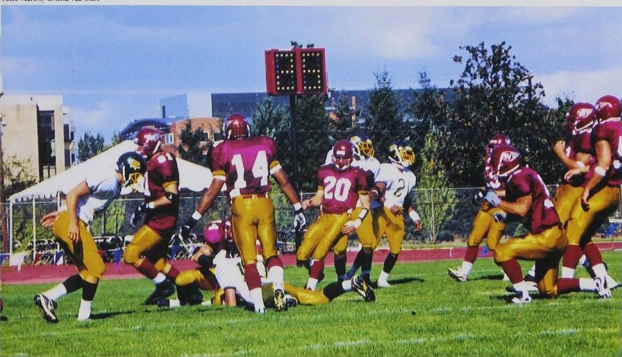

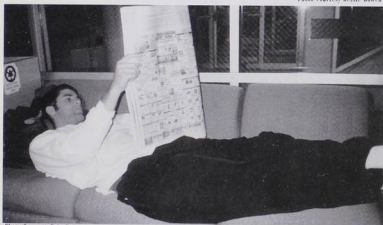

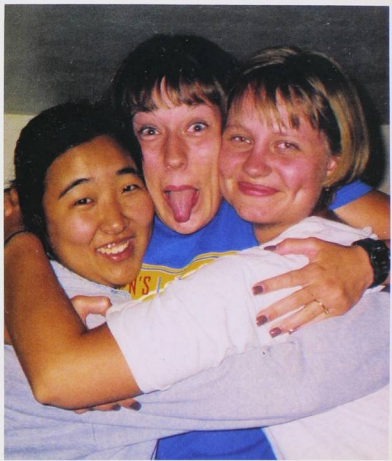

## CONFERENCE CHAMPS

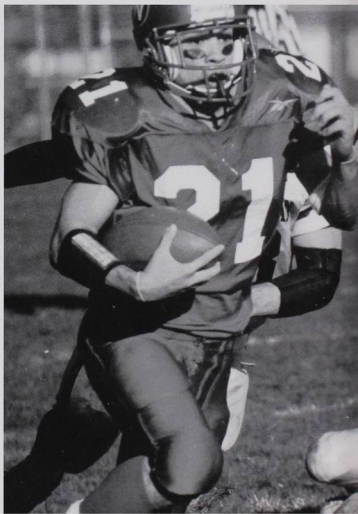
### Football

The Bearcat football team literally ran over their conference opponents this year with a high-powered running attack led by Tim Blair and Ardell Bailey. The offense was balanced by an unforgiving defense, led by co-NWC defensive player of the year Aaron Lawson, which enabled the team to win the conference. The Bearcats finished with a 7-3 record overall, 5-0 in conference, and advanced to the playoffs where they were unfortunately eliminated in the first round. Despite the loss, "It was a great season," remarked Head Coach Mark Speckman. We achieved our goals of winning the Northwest Conference Championship and making it to the NCAA playoffs."

The season began with two convincing wins over Colorado College (51-6) and Chapman (42-13) but then the team dropped three of their next four games. The Bearcats finally broke out of their slump with a 41-14 demolishing of Puget Sound that started a four game winning streak to close out the regular season. As first team all

conference defensive back Kamell Eckroth-Bernard says, "The defense and offense came together great at the end of the season and we accomplished some great wins." The greatest victory came at the end of the season when the Bearcats put an exclamation point on their conference title with a victory over Linfield (28-7). As Senior Radley Ott put it, "Overall it was a season with many highpoints that included the Linfield victory, going to the playoffs and the overall shared experience with the other players."

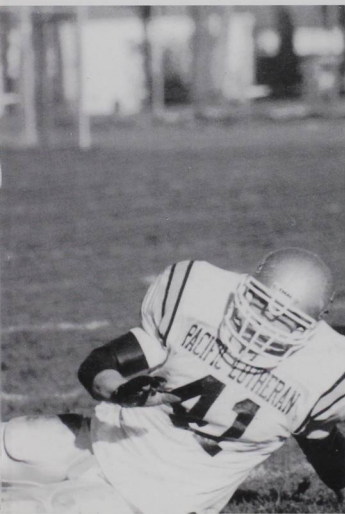

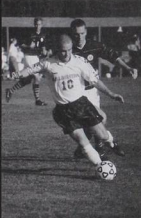

## Mens' Soccer

The men's team started out with high expectations with the return of nine starters, but was soon devastated with numerous injuries. Commenting on the disappointment Senior Kelly Walsh said, "It was a frustrating season, knowing at the start that we had a great deal of talent, and losing so many people due to injury really hurt us. Furthermore, El Forwardio's transfer papers weren't completed until just prior to the final game. Otherwise we might have contended for a national

championship because El Forwardio never misses." Despite the setback the team still enjoyed many highlights during the season. The season began with a trip to the beaches of sunny Hawaii where the team rebounded from a tough loss against Hawaii Pacific University to defeat them the following day 3-1. The team also traveled to hot and humid Texas and gave the top ranked Trinity team all they could handle before falling 1-0. After an exciting pre-season the injuries began to set in and the team suffered

several setbacks. The team lost the services of four players to season ending injuries. The season ended on a high note, however, with a 3-2 victory over Linfield. As coach Jim Tursi says in review, "The expectations at the beginning of the season were not met due to numerous injuries and some bad luck. ### Womens' Soccer

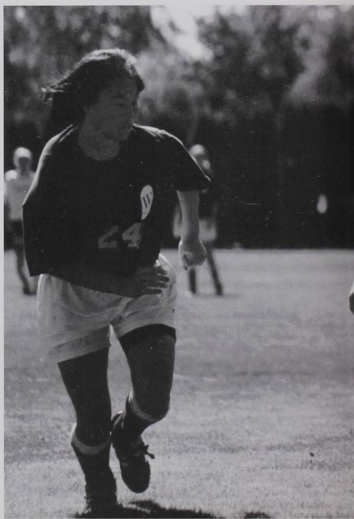
The Bearcat Women came into the season with high expectations after reaching the final four in the national tournament the previous year. The season ended abruptly, however, with a first round loss to Puget Sound in a penalty kick shootout. Katie Edmonds reflected that, "It was a good season during conference play when we went undefeated, but it was disappointing that we didn't go to the National Tournament."

Senior captain Edmonds led the team through an undefeated season and to an unprecedented seventh straight Northwest Conference title. The season began brightly in Hawaii with a tie and a 3-0 win over Hawaii Pacific University. The women faced their first real test when they played a stubborn Trinity team in Texas, after waking up at four in the morning and flying all day. The team fell behind 1-0 early in the second half, but continued to fight back, and managed to win the game 2-1. The women then proceeded to wipe out the competition in the NWC by going undefeated with only one tie. The women finished the regular season with a

record of 18-0-2. Looking back Coach Jim Tursi comments that, "It was a season of many highs and few lows. We accomplished our team goals for the year by advancing to the regional playoffs."

Next year the team looks to continue its winning ways, but will need to fill some big shoes. The team will miss NWC player of the year Katie Edmonds and leading scorer, Natalie Flindt along with defenders Jill Stratton and Jenna Ward.

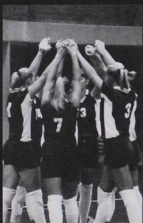

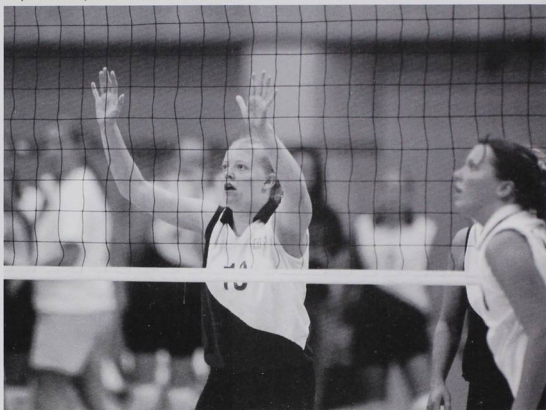

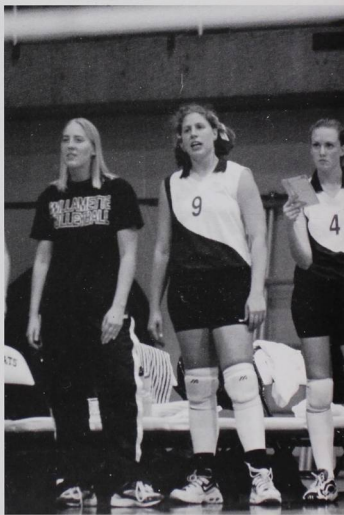

## Volleyball

This year's Bearcat volleyball team pulled together for a 12-4 conference record with the help of great senior leadership and skill depth; the four seniors, Renee Purdy, Devon Bakken, Tamarah Allen, and Andrea Cruickshank, were excellent team leaders and role models. "I think our team was definitely 18 strong this year...we were not carried by one individual," explained Junior setter Erica Henry.

The Bearcats started the season by winning the opening tournament at George Fox 4-0 and remained at

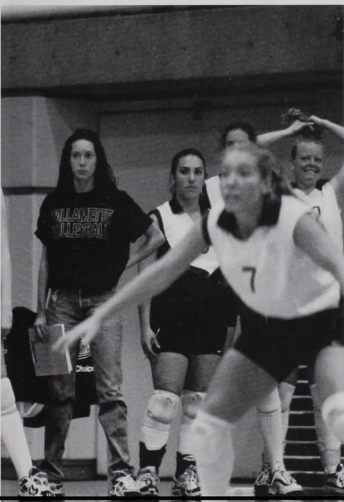
Junior Kelly Sorenson said, "We had a strong team, got along well, had fun, but missed playoffs."

"Overall the season was great, the women did exceptionally well. I was so proud of everyone. The men are still young so I am very excited for next year," stated Coach Kelly Sullivan.

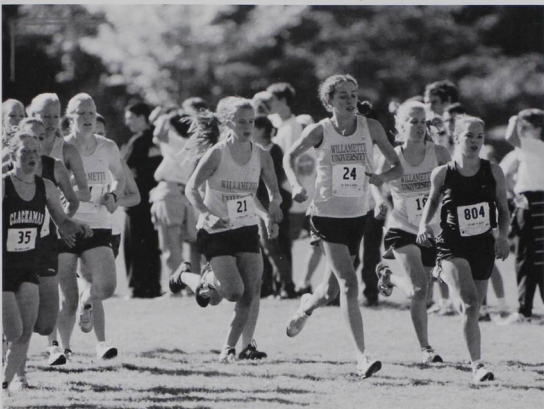

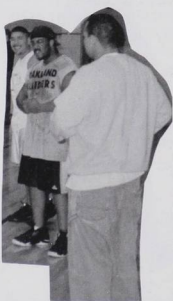
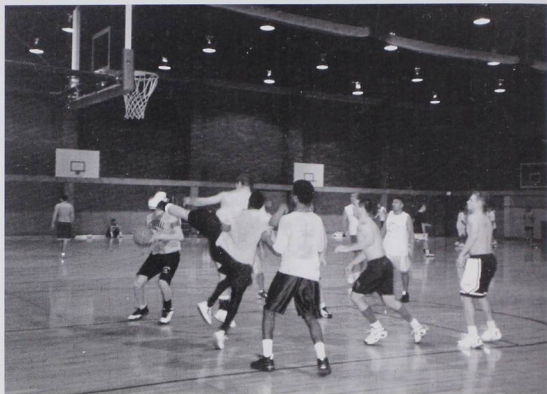

### Rugby

After being inactive for many years the Willamette Rugby Club was back for its second straight year of competition. This year for the first time they will play in a union (conference) with six other schools from around the Northwest. To start off the season the rugby team played three games in the Pacific Northwest Rugby Tournament. In the first game they played Lewis and Clark and easily beat them 15-0. In the second match they played a tough game against a strong team from Southern Oregon. ## Swimming

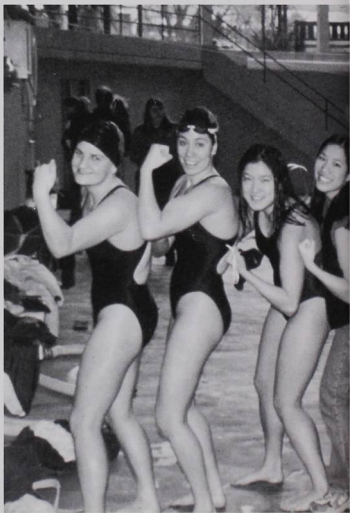

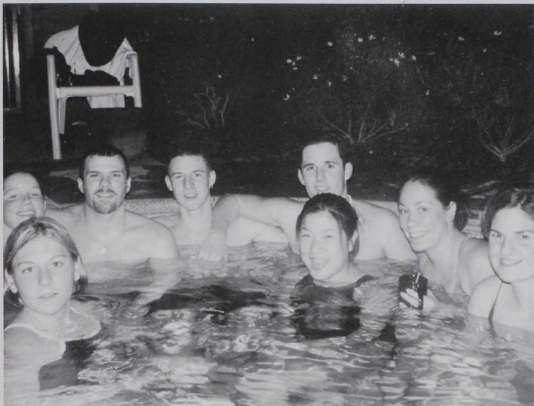
regular season on a high note-beating Lewis and Clark in the last regular season meet before conference championships.

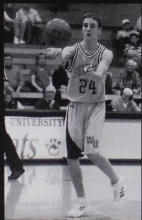

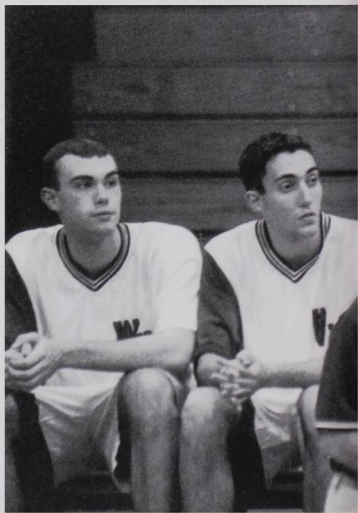

in conference and a fourth place finish in the conference. As a result they were awarded the last bid into the conference tournament.

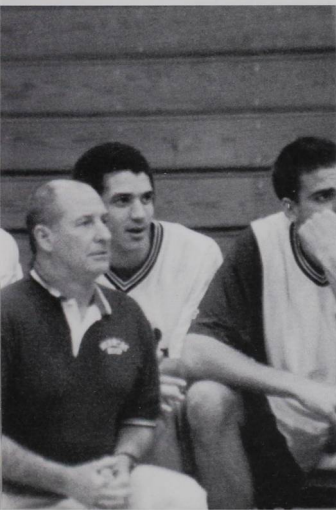

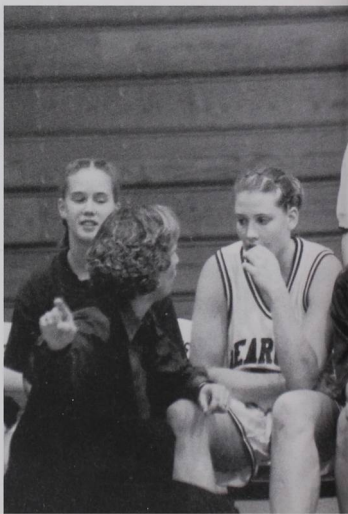
One bright spot during the season came on February 5th when they played Lewis & Clark College. The women scored a season high 104 points to win by 35. The success on that night was not a huge

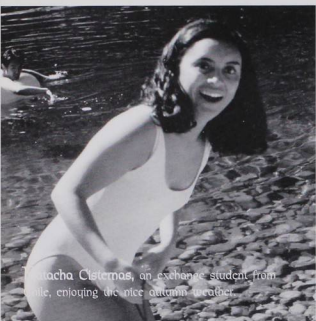

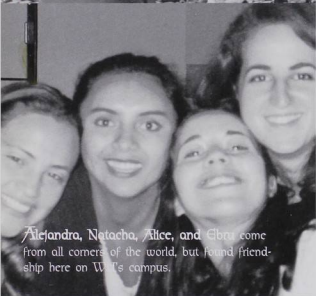

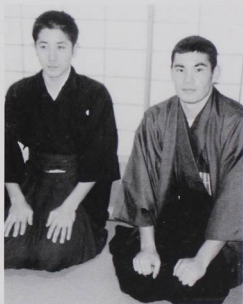

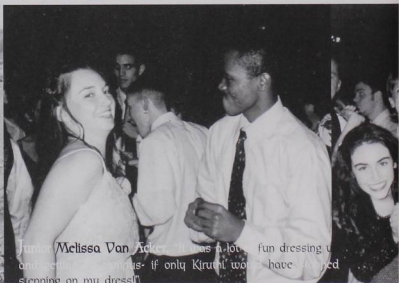

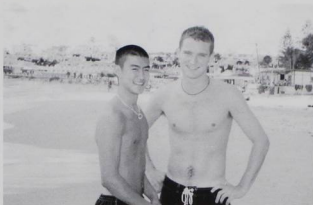

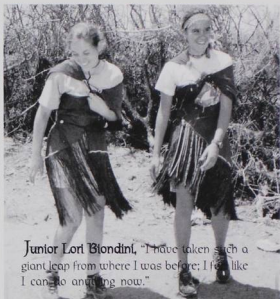

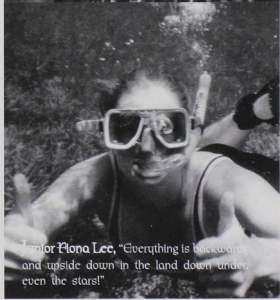

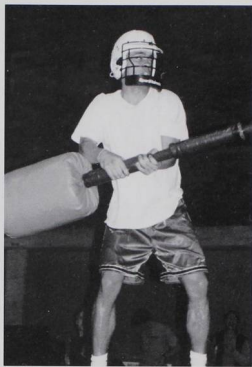

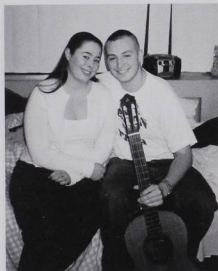

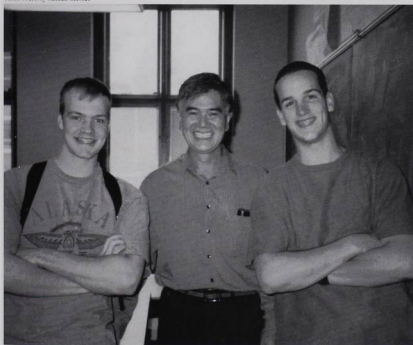

**Robert A. Booth** a lumberman, did not attend Willamette University but became part of the Staff in 1904 as part of the Board of Trustees. He served til 1943. He is credited for inspiring Willamette endowment. He pledged \$100,000 to Willamette in 1908 for the endowment which was and now is used for scholarship purposes.

**James Booth** and his sons, all graduates from Willamette. From top to bottom: James, Brian [93' grad], Jeff [95' grad], and Jay [91' grad]. Jim has been working as part of the Board of Trustees for about 20 years now. He is carrying on the tradition of his family you could say, because his great grandfather Robert A. # THE MANY PRESIDENTS OF WILLAMETTE

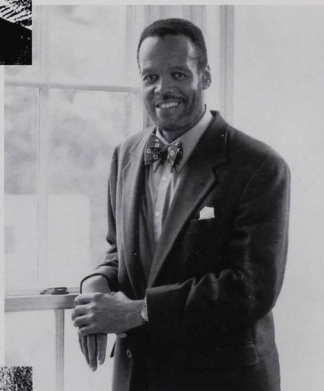


President F.S. Hoyt, D.D. was the first president of Willamette University. He served from 1853-1869.

President M. Lee Pelton is the current President of Willamette. He is Willamette's 22nd President. He earned an undergraduate degree at Wichita State University with a double major in English and Psychology. He later earned a doctorate at Harvard in English, American Literature and Languages. Before he came here he was the dean at Dartmouth.



President J.H. Wyrhe, A.M., D.D. was called the most erudite scholar of all the presidents, being a skilled surgeon, an ordained minister, and fluent in Greek, Latin, and Hebrew. However, the trustees failed to renew his contract after only two years at Willamette largely because he refused to stop smoking cigars and his pipe in public, in spite of repeated complaints by the Methodist Conference and the trustees.



President Carl Gregg Doney at age 48 with a degree in law, a long series of pastorates, and eight years of experience as president of West Virginia Wesleyan College, became the 12th president of Willamette. His contributions to the physical campus and to the financial strength of Willamette were astounding. He saw frivolities of dancing, drinking, and smoking as shackles to be avoided or cast off to permit the highest attainment of human potential. President Doney retired at the age of 67. That was when the first limited dance experiments were permitted.

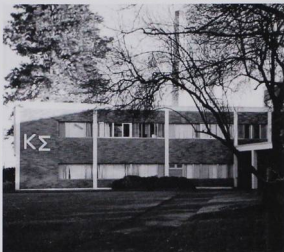

Kappa Sigma was founded in 1869 and came to Willamette in 1961. Led by President Shawn Bagley, the Kappa Sigma men put on a wide variety of fundraisers to earn money for the Leukemia Society of America. Kappa Sigma's main fundraiser is the Tracey Hoffman Memorial Walk/Run. They earn upwards of two to three thousand dollars each year to donate. 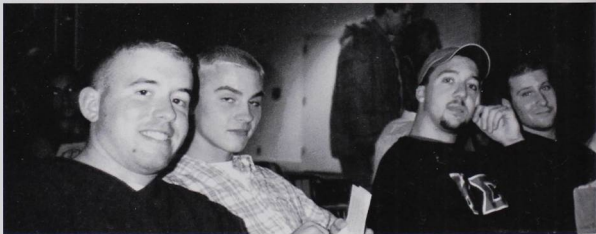

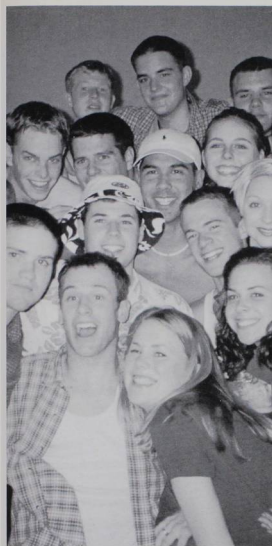

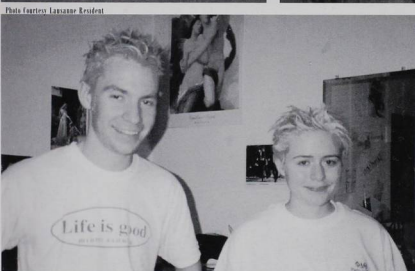

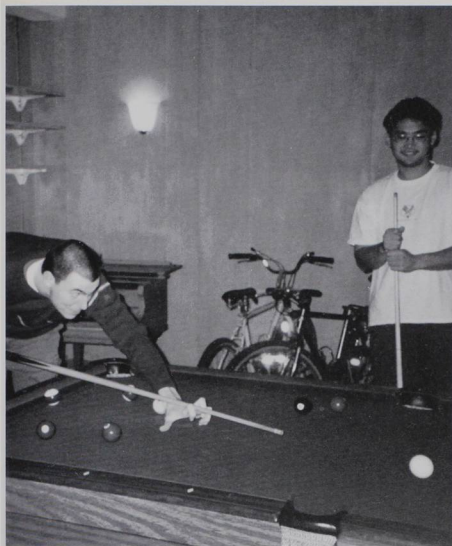

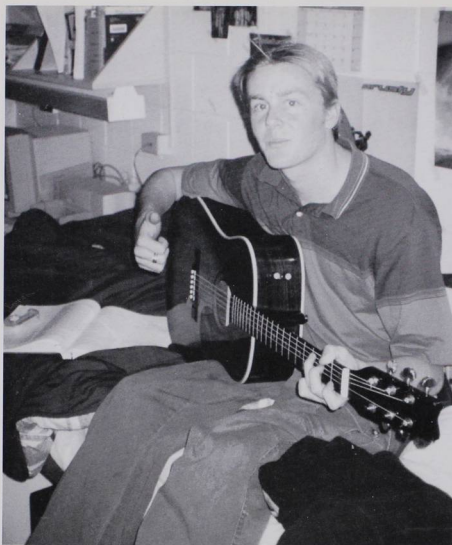

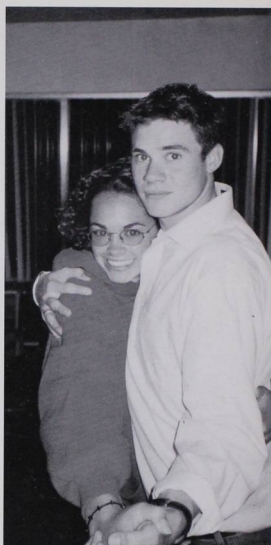

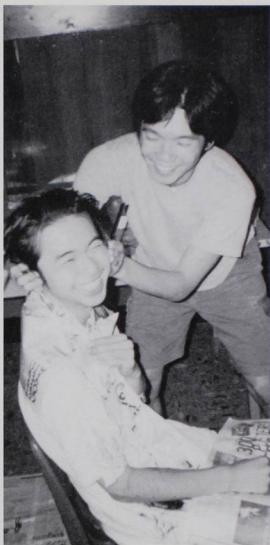

# **DEAN LAWRENCE CRESS**

On April 3, 2000 the Willamette Community was shocked by the sudden collapse and death of Dean Lawrence Cress. Commonly known as Larry to most friends and faculty, he was serving his 6th year as Dean of the Liberal Arts College. He came to Willamette after serving as associate dean and the Jay P. Walker professor of history at the University of Tulsa. Cress was originally from the Northwest, however, having attended Pacific Lutheran University before completing his Ph.D in History at the University of Virginia. In addition to his dean duties at Willamette, Cress became the first Dwight and Margaret Lear Professor of American History in 1997. A few reflections include, "He provided a model of thoughtful growth; he was a man gracefully able to change his mind on the basis of new information or perception," said Carol Long. President Pelton said, "Dean Cress was an intelligent and energetic administrator who combined a passion for teaching and scholarship with a strong devotion to the welfare of our faculty and a commitment to the intellectual development of our undergraduates." One student reflects, "He deeply loved the process of learning and the academic experience...he did more for the students than we will probably ever realize." His loss will be deeply felt and his energetic spirit will be sorely missed. As a community we send out our prayers and thoughts to his family and friends and we will never again be the same. ## WATTS LEADS THE WAY Mens' Track and Field

The Bearcat Men's track team comes into the season with high hopes and a large team. Last year the team finished in the middle of the conference, with the brightest moment coming at the end of the season from Jimmy Watts. He qualified for Nationals in the decathlon with the Nation's top score of 6,798 points. After five events, however, he found himself in fifth place. He then went on to record personal bests in the final three events of the competition, the pole vault, javelin and 1500 meters to win the national title with a personal best of 7,111 points. Watts became the first male athlete from Willamette to win a national track and field title since 1966.

This year Jimmy Watts went to the 53rd Annual Florida Relays in Gainesville, Fla. and surpassed his mark in the decathlon from last year. He set a new personal record of 7,160 points and finished sixth overall out of 20 of the Nations' premier Division I decathletes.

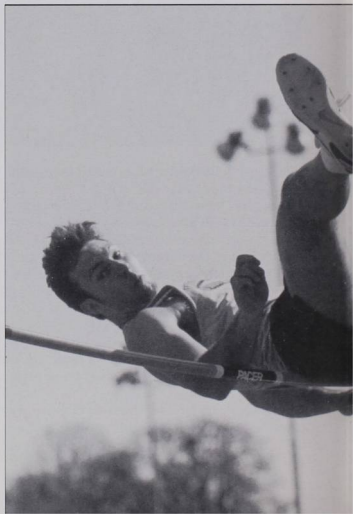
This year the team is full of new people eager to build a strong track team. As coach Kelly Sullivan says, "With the arrival of so many new faces and already a solid core of

The team started to shine at the Willamette Open where the sun also came out for the first time during the season. Jimmy Watts placed third in the hurdles, Adam Dittman PR'd to place second in the shot put, Paul Colby PR'd to place third in the high hurdles and David Austin ran a season best in the 100m dash to finish fourth out of 35 runners. The Bearcats hope to continue their success as the conference meet approaches.

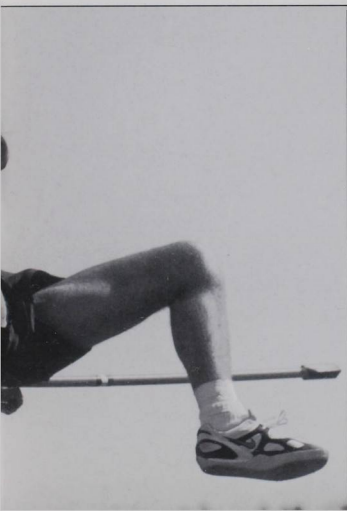

# INFIRMARY REPORT

## Womens' Track and Field

The Bearcat women return two National qualifiers from last years team. Junior Monica Scott finished fifth in the javelin with a throw of 135-7 which was a personal best for her. The other qualifier was Senior captain Beth Fitzgerald who won the 800 meter dash. She entered the event as the number one seed and never looked back. She won the event in 2:11.77 and didn't even have to break her personal record of 2:09.48 which she set earlier in the year. The points from those two women helped the Bearcats finish

with 14 team points that placed them in a tie for 16th in the nation.

This year Fitzgerald has qualified again for the nationals in the 800m and 1500m. She ran a time of 4:34.84 in the 1500m and just missed the school record by less than a second.

During spring break two heptathletes competed in two different multi events. Senior JJ Hurley competed at Linfield College and scored 3,741 points to finish sixth. Laura Leineweber flew south to Florida to compete in the Florida

Relays. She finished fifteenth overall in a strong field of Division I athletes.

This year coach Kelly Sullivan is excited about the women's team and their chances to do well. As he says, "With seventeen new freshmen and solid upperclassmen leadership, the women's team looks to have a solid showing at both conference and nationals." After training hard for this years championship season the women's team will have a new track surface to look forward to for training next year.

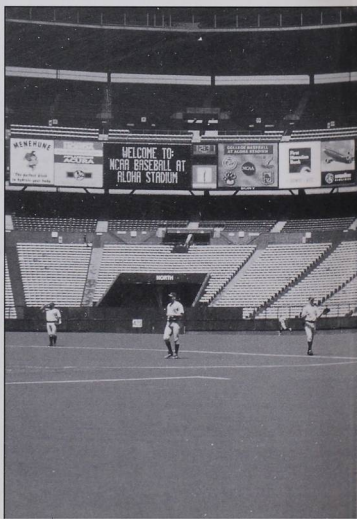

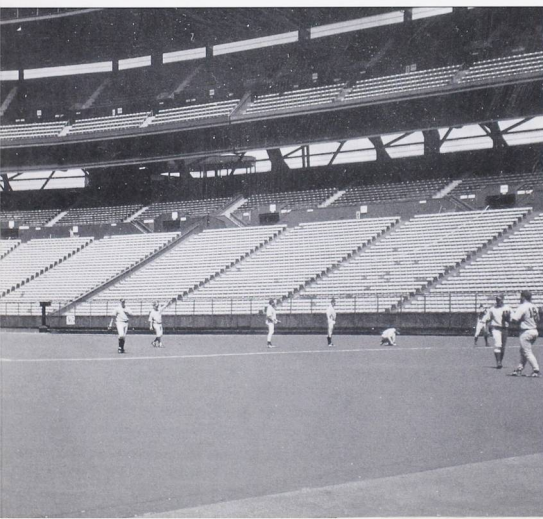

had a lot of expectations for myself going into the match and I had been looking forward to it all season and was ready to beat him."

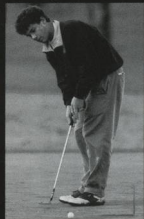

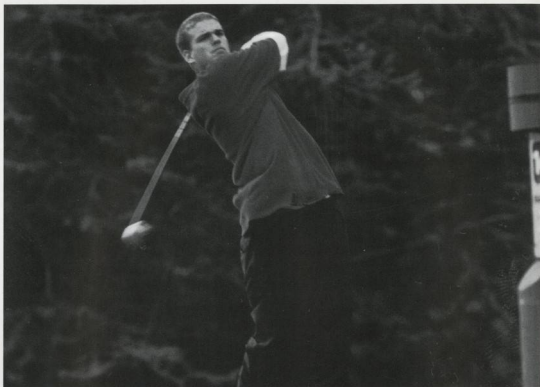

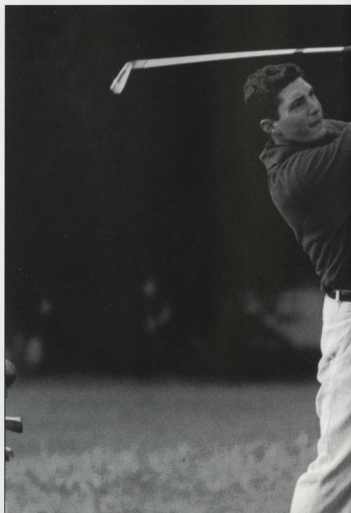

Hawaii Club is yet another active multi-cultural club. Some of the highlighted events from

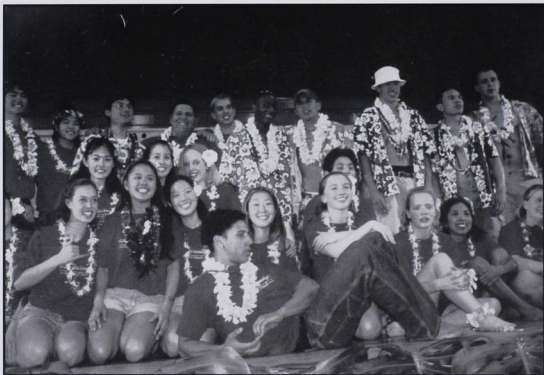

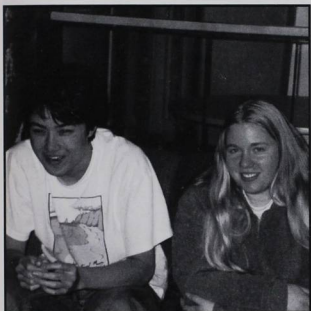

# MUSIC

The instrumental program at Willamette University includes the University Band, Wind Ensemble and Jazz Ensemble.

The University Band comprises students desiring to continue in band at the college level. The University Band performs on campus several times each semester in conjunction with Wind Ensemble.

Wind Ensemble is a 30-40 member auditioned ensemble. The Wind Ensemble performs in on-campus concert and takes

a semi-annual tour.

Jazz Ensemble is open to all university students on an audition basis. They perform regularly at campus "Jazz Nights," local festivals and semi-annual tours.

Events this year for WU bands included "Jazz Night" every month, Jazz Festival with Bill Watrous (world renowned Jazz trombonist), Parent's Weekend Concert and the Fall Bands and

Choir Concert.

The choir program at Willamette include the Chamber Choir, Willamette Singers, University Women's Choir and Male Ensemble Willamette.

Chamber Choir is a 40-voice ensemble open by audition to all WU students. This year the group toured through the Northwest through Eugene, Bend, Boise, ID., Missoula, MT., and the Tri-cities.
