Campus Capsules

Conference Explores Teaching, Learning

Once again the annual Faculty-Student Conference has sparked a meaningful interchange of ideas in the interest of improving the University.

Theme of this year's conference was "The Teaching-Learning Process at Willamette," with seven topics encompassing methods of teaching, grading, student and faculty recruitment, life style of students, and academic freedom.

Initial benefit was expressed through "the increased understanding which faculty and students have of each other as a result of their interaction in the conference." Long range benefits are expected as the better ideas are acted upon by various committees.

Dr. W. T. Jones, Professor of Philosophy at Pomona College, was the keynote speaker for the conference. He believes that today's students want an immediate, direct experience in their education. Neither the lecture style of "thrusting in" nor the "drawing out" style of student directed questions or discussion will completely satisfy the student. Education is a dialogue, he said, and both the teacher and student need to develop a life style that offers a freedom of options in the teaching-learning process.

Rhodes Scholar Lauds Undergraduate Study

"Sometimes when living becomes a bit too abstract and isolated here, I wish for the warmth and assurance of that small worthy community in Salem."

So wrote Rhodes Scholar Hikaru Kerns '69 who is now studying Japanese intellectual history at Oxford University.

After noting the laborious (but exciting) research he's involved with and the bril-

liant people with whom he works, he wrote "The value of Willamette, from this perspective, was in its handful of dedicated, brilliant professors who, instead of research or publishing, concentrated their talents and love to teaching students. To me, they made all the difference."

Students Seek Academic Innovations

"Student government has encompassed two areas, those of social affairs and rules of conduct. Without ignoring those areas, we're entering a third area - academic affairs - which will become even more important next year."

Thus spoke junior Lauren Ronald, first vice president of the ASWU, upon the formulation of a 26-student Academic Affairs Committee. The committee plans to initiate several innovative proposals in the next few weeks aimed toward further stimulation of Willamette's academic life.

First item of business for the committee, which operates under the sanction of the Student Senate and recommends proposals to faculty committees, is a study of the University's foreign language requirement for graduation.

Dean Emeritus Writes Chronicles, Volume 2

A second volume of "The Chronicles of Willamette" will come off the press in the fall. Written by Dean Emeritus Robert Gregg, the volume will cover the period from 1942 to 1970. The late Dr. Robert M. Gatke, author of the first volume covering Willamette's first 100 years, was working on the second volume at the time of his death in December of 1968. Dean Gregg was history professor and Dean of Liberal Arts from 1948-1966.

75 Musicians Prepare For European Tour

Lengthy rehearsals, orientation and fund raising activities are keeping 75 student musicians occupied before their May 19 departure to Europe.

Under the direction of choir director Walter Farrier and band director Maurice Brennen, Willamette's "Musical Kaleidoscope" will perform in seven countries prior to a July 1 return. The countries include England, France, Italy, Austria, Germany, Czechoslovakia, and Switzerland.

To help ease the \$850 per person cost, the musicians have held a public auction and are selling etched stationery to raise money. Former director of admissions Al Fedje, now with the American Heritage

Association, is conducting the orientation and handling the travel arrangements.

Freshman Glee Adopts Different Theme

The 62nd annual Freshman Glee observance will unfold April 4 with some new looks. The theme sequence has been changed by the executive Glee committee, with "Today" replacing "Fight Song." The latter has been one of the four rotating themes over the years, the others being "Serenade", "Alma Mater", and "Novelty."

A Friday night dance and Saturday picnic have been added to the overall festivities "to relieve the pre-Glee night tensions." Blue Monday and the Mill Stream walk remain unchanged.

Sophomore Earns WU Service Award

Sophomore Sharon Fisher of Gladstone is the first recipient of the "Service to Community Award," a \$100 prize offered by President and Mrs. Fritz to the student "who has made the most significant contribution during the year toward bringing an improved spirit of true community at Willamette."

Miss Fisher was chosen by Chaplain Phil Harder and a group of student leaders for the quality and intensity of her involvement in a variety of student activities and community service.

Establishment of the prize was first announced at the Christmas Festival. Dr. Fritz noted that "we do not want to emphasize the financial incentive involved in this gift, but rather think of it as a tangible means of recognizing contributions of time, effort and talent to strengthen our community in all its aspects."

Students Assist in Community School Study

A proposed community school program in Salem is getting an assist from Willamette students.

Under the direction of education professor Dr. Wright Cowger, students are conducting house-to-house surveys to determine personal preferences about educational, social, recreational and cultural programs which might be centered at their neighborhood school.

The surveys are centered in one district to determine needs in the pilot program which follows the general lines of the nationally known Flint, Mich. Community School concept. Dr. Cowger was in a Salem delegation that visited Flint earlier.

Following an identification of the needs as a result of the surveys, "community school directors and advisory committees can marshal the resources and services to meet the needs," said Dr. Cowger.

Science Area Shows Quality; Seeks More Majors

ON THE basis of faculty, facilities and curriculum, the natural science and mathematics division of the University has never been stronger.

The quality of the students in the biology, chemistry, earth science, mathematics, physics and psychology fields within the division has been consistently high. Some 62½ per cent of the graduates in the division the past five years have gone on to post-graduate study (compared to 49 per cent for all other majors).

The computer center is flourishing, not only within the division, but through its use by other departments and offices of the University.

Conditions in Collins Hall have never been better for offering a sound science education, but a problem exists: fewer students are selecting science majors.

Student interest in the natural sciences and mathematics has been on a downward curve since the post-Sputnik boom. The gently swaying academic pendulum that lurched markedly in the vacuum of Sputnik's space launch has been slowly swinging to the aid of the social morass that has and is still developing.

A shift of interest from the natural to the social sciences has been a national phenomenon. Some will say it has been long overdue, believing that the social sciences provide better tools for coping with the ills of society, many of which are the by-products of technological advances.

"We recognize what is happening," commented biology professor Donald Breakey, "but we've also got a stake in the environmental problems." He and physics professor Robert Purbrick believe that student interest in the natural sciences will soon start on the upswing.

Dean of admissions Richard Yocom offers some encouragement in this regard, as more of the prospective fall entrants have indicated an interest in the natural science and mathematics area than any other single area. "Obviously we can't tell if this is a national trend, but at least it may mean that more students at Willamette will consider a science or math major than in recent years."

He went on to express an opinion that Willamette and liberal arts colleges in general can help satisfy a real need in society for scientists with liberal arts backgrounds. "The scientist who has an appreciation and an awareness of the other disciplines can more effectively communicate his ideas to people in the other fields of interest."

His view closely parallels the statement of the natural Science and Mathematics (NS/M) concentration area at Willamette, which "places great emphasis on the integration of knowledge in the liberal arts context rather than an academic plan which stresses complete specialization." The statement also notes that "truly effective citizens require scientific understanding while those individuals planning on such careers as medicine, dentistry, research science, and engineering should have superior preparation in each of the many science courses and research programs."

A number of progressive changes have occurred within the NS/M concentration area as a result of close communication and cooperation among the six departments. Various grants, including the recent \$234,000 grant from the National Science Foundation's College Science Improvement Program (COSIP), have been acquired through inter-departmental organization. Calculating machines, a shop room, visual aids, and certain office equipment are shared and were purchased through a pooling of funds.

Most recently, the NS/M area co-sponsored a "Science Day" at Willamette with the admissions office. High School science teachers and students in Marion and Polk Counties were invited for dinner and an evening program and open house. Each department prepared demonstrations and gave an overview of their curriculum. About 140 attended, and the response was termed "enthusiastic" by Dr. Breakey.

"We felt it was a successful venture, but

we don't know for sure if this attracted any students. They (the guests) were generally impressed with the facilities, and a number of teachers were amazed with the equipment we have."

In addition to equipment and facilities, the strength of the Willamette science division rests with the faculty. The area encompasses 20 full time and four part time teachers, 16 of whom have their doctorates. Within departments, the interests and training of the professors are quite varied.

In biology, the department includes a botanist with a special interest in taxonomy; a molecular biologist; a physiologist with special interest in marine invertebrates; and a zoologist with interest in ecology and the vertebrates.

Chemistry, staffed with four full time and one part time professor, each with the Ph.D., is likewise quite varied. Each of the full time professors was prepared in a specialty area, analytical, inorganic, organic and physical. Last April, the department was added to the list of schools approved by the American Chemical Society for undergraduate education in chemistry.

With the exception of Earth Science, which is still a one-man, non-major department, the other departments within the NS/M area offer similar variety.

In summing up the problem of the NS/M area to attract more students, Dean Yocom said "It's time that we let people know how good we are in the science area. Alumni support in spreading the word can be extremely valuable."

A JOYFUL TRIBUTE

Honoring the G. Herbert Smiths for 27 eventful years



LAUGHTER was frequent for Dr. and Mrs. G. Herbert Smith during the "Evening of Tribute" in their honor Jan. 31, capping 27 years of dedicated service to Willamette. Some 435 guests were present for the first social occasion in the new George Putnam University Center.

THE University with the West's oldest heritage paid homage to its leader with the longest service.

During an "Evening of Tribute" Jan. 31, Chancellor (now President Emeritus) G. Herbert Smith and his gracious wife Eugenia were feted by 435 guests who joined in an expression of praise and gratitude for the Smiths' 27 years of devoted service to Willamette.

Banquet facilities at the new George Putnam University Center were stretched to the limit for the gala occasion, but many more alumni and friends joined in the tribute through letters and contributions to the Dr. G. Herbert Smith scholarship fund.

Just three hours after Dr. Smith directed the formal dedication of the new University Center facilities, the guests were seated in the spacious "Bearcat Cavern" when a brass choir fanfare heralded the entrance of the honored couple. The Smiths were joined by their daughters, Sally (Mrs. George W. Gunn) and Margaret (Mrs. Joseph M. Hardman) who had arrived from Arkansas and Maryland respectively for the tribute.

Dr. Smith's successor, President Roger J. Fritz, served as master of ceremonies, while U. S. Senator Mark O. Hatfield '43 delivered the address of tribute. Sen. Hatfield good naturedly reflected upon his years under Dr. Smith as a student, alumnus, faculty member, administrator and now as a trustee. He called Dr. Smith "the builder of people and buildings," posturing the University with a deft hand through the difficult times of the war years and revolutions in technology, edu-

cation and social awareness.

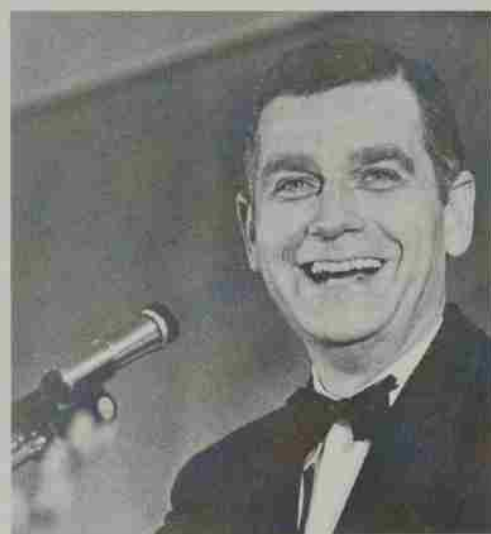
He said Dr. Smith's life was characterized by the University motto, "Not unto ourselves alone are we born," and "the best honor we can give him is not words, but to pursue the vision he has given us."

In addition to receiving a certificate for "permanent appointment" as President Emeritus, the trustees established a permanent tribute by naming the Fine Arts Auditorium the G. Herbert Smith Auditorium and Fine Arts Building. Many people helped endow the Dr. G. Herbert Smith scholarship fund, which to date totals over \$30,000. The student body presented a large oil portrait of Dr. Smith that will be displayed permanently. Title to the 1970 automobile that he was using as Chancellor was turned over to the Smiths and they received a bound volume of letters from many friends. Mrs. Smith received a gold and pearl pendant from the Faculty Women's Club.

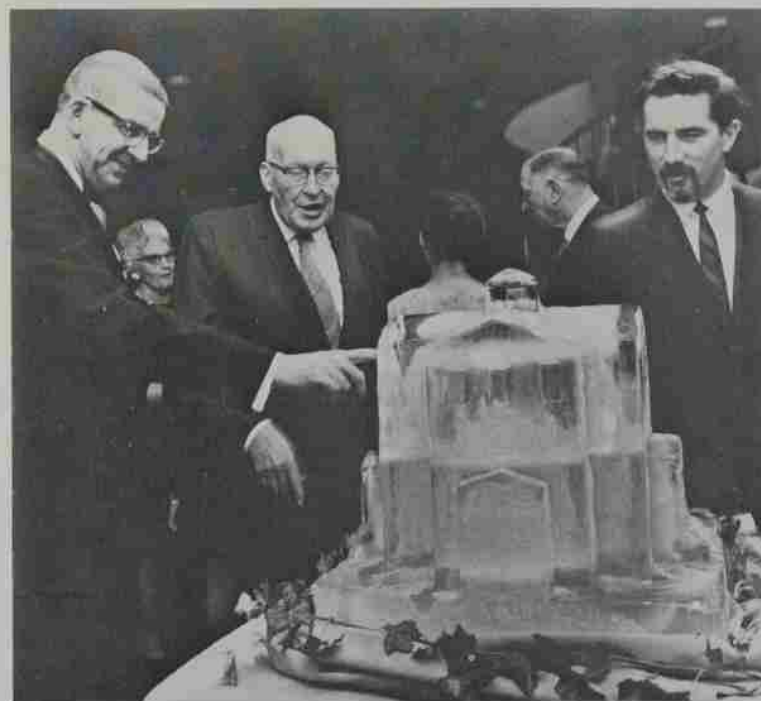
Dr. Smith humbly acknowledged the gifts and said "just having you here would have been enough. Our hearts are full of memories and it has been a great privilege to be here for 27½ years and in such wonderful company."

He responded to some of the anecdotes told by Sen. Hatfield, but in a serious vein, Dr. Smith indicated that the leadership of the University is in good hands. He views the future of Willamette with confidence and "the University in the days ahead should go from strength to strength."

On his impending retirement, he recalled some philosophy of a former post office custodian on that subject: "When ya see yer gonna get throwed, jump off!"

The National Scene

PREPARED FOR OUR READERS BY THE EDITORS OF THE CHRONICLE OF HIGHER EDUCATION

■ **Quiet Spring?** In marked contrast to the wave of student unrest they experienced last spring, the nation's colleges and universities were fairly quiet last semester. Observers wonder: Will the calm continue in 1970 and beyond? There are signs that it may not. Ideological disputes have splintered the radical Students for a Democratic Society, but other groups of radicals are forming. Much of the anti-war movement has drifted off the campuses, but student activists are turning to new issues—such as problems of the environment and blue-collar workers. A nationwide survey of this year's freshmen, by the way, shows them to be more inclined than their predecessors to engage in protests.

■ **Enter, Environment:** Air and water pollution, the "population explosion," ecology—those are some of the things students talk about these days. The environment has become the focus of widespread student concern. "Politicization can come out of it," says a former staff member of the National Student Association who helped plan a student-faculty conference on the subject. "People may be getting a little tired of race and war as issues." Throughout the country, students have begun campaigns, protests, even lawsuits, to combat environmental decay. Milepost ahead: April 22, the date of a "teach-in" on the environment that is scheduled to be held on many campuses.

■ **Catching Up:** Publicly supported Negro colleges, said to enroll about a third of all Negroes in college today, are pressing for "catch-up" funds from private sources—corporations, foundations, alumni. Their presidents are telling prospective donors: "If you don't invest in these colleges and make it possible for Negroes to get an education, you will be supporting them on the welfare rolls with your taxes." Coordinating the fund-raising effort is the Office for the Advancement of Public Negro Colleges, Atlanta, Ga.

■ **Nonresident Tuition:** An Ohio woman married a resident of California and moved with him to that state. When she enrolled in the state university there, it charged her \$324 more per quarter than it charged California residents. Unfair? The woman said it was, and asked the courts to declare the higher fee unconstitutional. State courts dismissed her challenge and now their judgment

has been left standing by the U.S. Supreme Court. The decision suggests that an earlier ruling of that court, which overturned state residence requirements for relief applicants, does not apply to higher education. Nearly 800,000 students are thought to be enrolled in colleges outside their home states.

■ **Money Trouble:** Many members of Congress favor more federal funds for higher education, but President Nixon balks at the notion. He vetoed the 1970 appropriations bill for labor, health, and education on grounds it was inflationary, and the lawmakers failed to override him. Further austerity is signaled by the President's budget for 1971. He wants to phase out several programs of aid to colleges and universities, hold back on new spending for academic research, rely more on private funds. In the states, meanwhile, the pace of public support for major state colleges and universities may be slowing, according to reports from 19 capitals. Overall, state appropriations for higher education continue to grow, with much of the new money going to junior colleges.

■ **Foundation Tax:** Exempted for decades from federal taxation, the nation's private foundations must now pay the government 4 per cent of their net investment income each year. Congress requires the payment in its Tax Reform Act of 1969, which also restricts a number of foundation activities. One initial effect could be a proportionate cut in foundation grants to colleges and universities. Foundation leaders also warn that private institutions generally—including those in higher education—are threatened by federal hostility. The new act, says one foundation executive, reflects an attitude of "vast indifference" in Washington toward the private sector.

■ **Double Jeopardy:** Should a college's accreditation be called into question if it experiences student disruption over an extended period of time? In some cases, yes, says the agency that accredits higher education institutions in the mid-Atlantic states. Although it won't summarily revoke a college's accreditation because of disruption by "forces beyond its control," the agency does plan to review cases in which an institution suffers "prolonged inability to conduct its academic programs."
