WILLAMETTE UNIVERSITY, Salem (Special)—After a week of exhausting early morning, noon and evening rehearsals, students at Willamette University <sup>for it</sup> say they're ready for the 63rd annual Freshman Glee <sup>Nov 11</sup> to be held Saturday, April 3, at 8 p.m. in the University gymnasium.

Freshman Glee, one of Willamette's oldest traditions, is competition between classes, featuring original songs and marching formations by each, geared to the main theme of "Novelty" and the sub-theme "Tomorrow Never Knows".

The presentations will be scored by a panel of judges including State Representative Tony Meeker of Amity, who is a 1961 graduate of Willamette and former student body president; Captain Pat Kahler, U.S.M.C.; and Jon Hayner, who was graduated from Willamette in 1970. They will judge formation.

Judging vocal rendition will be Dean Emeritus Malvin Gaist, Salem; Ronald Wynn, choral director at the Oregon College of Education; Dean Emeritus Robert Gregg, Salem; and Steven Stone, director of music at Aloha High School.

Words and music will be scored by Mrs. Ted Shay, '67 Willamette graduate; Professor Edger Smith, head of the music department at OCE; and Gladys Fay Blue, associate professor of music at Kent State University, <sup>Nov 11</sup> who will not be able to attend the presentation.

The class songs and composers include Freshman, "Sundown the Slides" by Paul Broucek (cq), Oak Park, Ill.; Sophomore, "Ain't Nothin' Gonna Stop" by Jon West, Oakland, Calif.; Junior, "Will It Last, My Friend" by Charles White, Citrus Heights, Calif.; and Senior, "Tomorrow Never Knows" by Dave Hjelt, Portland.

The winning class will be presented the Glee Banner and losing class will wade the Mill Race (cq) on Blue Monday, <sup>Nov 11</sup> April 5, when all bets are collected by winners during an 11 a.m. assembly in the gymnasium.

Glee Manager Dale Sause (cq), a freshman from Portland, announced pre-Glee activities are planned including a dance Friday, April 2, from 9 p.m. to midnight in the Cat Cavern of the University Center and a pre-Glee Banquet to honor judges, committee chairman, Glee staff and special guests to be held Saturday, April 3, at 5 p.m. in Doney Hall.

Glee tickets are now on sale for \$1 per person in the University Center Ticket Office and Stevens and Son Jewelers. Tickets will also be sold at the door.
