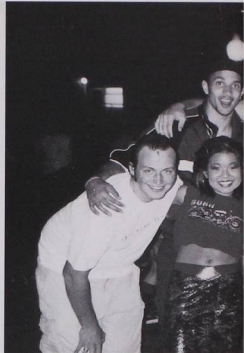

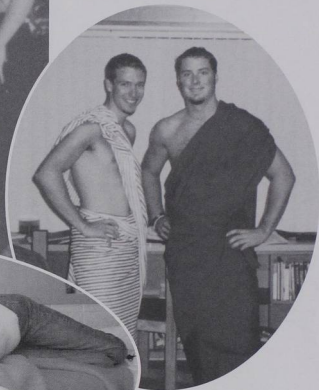

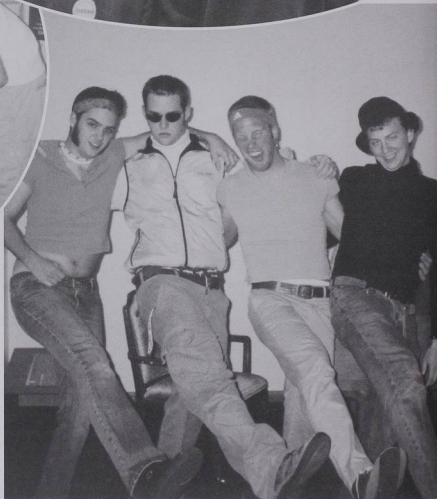
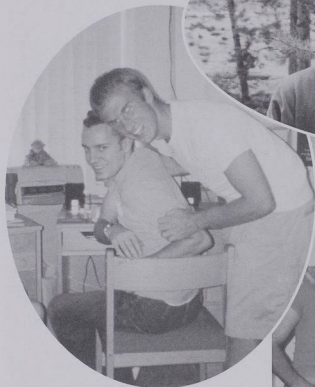

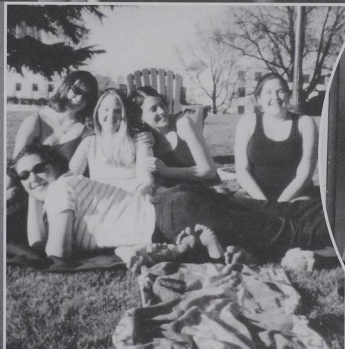

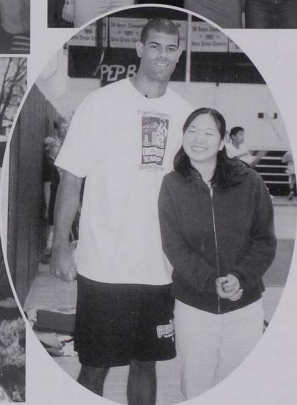

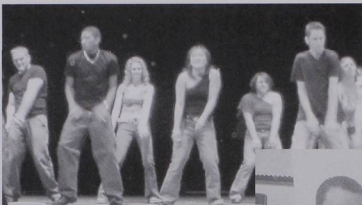

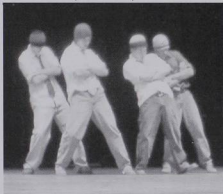

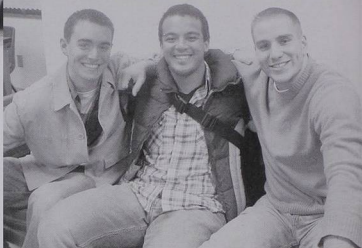

Willamette sponsored several governing clubs this past year. Associated Students of Willamette University, or more commonly known as ASWU, was the main governing body on our campus. ASWU provided many valuable services to students on campus, and helped behind the scenes to keep Willamette running smoothly. The Senate role within the school was different, although extremely important, because it provided students a direct voice in campus operations. All the different housing systems on campus had their own governing bodies. The dorms were represented by House of Hall Representatives, or HHR. This past year, HHR's focus shifted from sponsoring activities to take on more of a governing role within residence halls. The Greek System was regulated by two different organizations. The fraternities worked with Interfraternity Council (IFC) to come together and improve relations with both the sororities and with independents. Panhellenic Council (PHC) took on this same role for the sororities. Not all life at Willamette was all work and no play, though. The Willamette Events Board, more commonly known as WEB, took on a more programming emphasis rather than governing and organization. WEB brought various forms of entertainment, such as movies, dances, comedians and hypnotists, and further learning opportunities, such as speakers, controversial movies, and forums to students this past year.

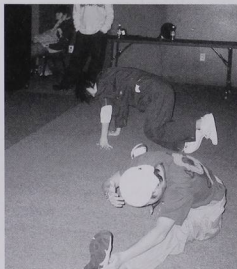

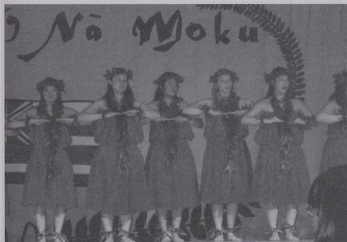

Willamette Multicultural clubs offered activities as diverse as the students that made up the clubs themselves. The Asian Student Association (ASA) sponsored activities like a Crossover Dance with break-dancing and Poi Fire Dancers. Unidos Por Fin was also active, sponsoring the Homecoming Salsa Dance at the Montag Center. Their purpose was to help students maintain their cultural identities, Latino, Mexican, and Hispanic, by promoting various films, speakers, and ethnic celebrations. Alaska Club's purpose was to encourage Alaskan culture and support Alaskans on campus. Their main event was the annual Salmon Bake held every spring. The Black Student Association (BSA) encouraged cultural awareness and promoted educational programs on African American issues. Activities included the Get'cha Freak On Dance, Kwanza Celebration, Black History Celebration, and the Celebration of Color. The Native American Enlightenment Association (NAEA) was very active during the year, sponsoring such events as Native American dancers and a Native American movie series. Members took great pride in the planning and execution of the annual Lu'au, which brought a little of the friendly Hawaiian spirit to campus every April. 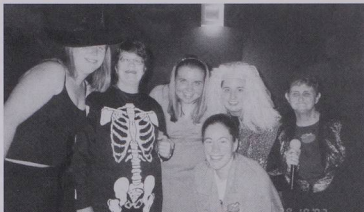

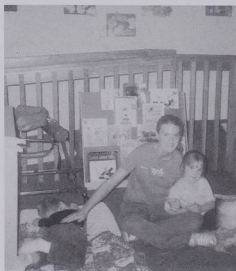

Willamette provided many opportunities for students to get involved and serve the community this past year. Both Alpha Phi Omega and Circle K were service organizations based on developing leadership, promoting friendship, and providing service to both Willamette University and the surrounding community. For students who excelled in scholarship, an opportunity to serve the community was provided through the National Society of Collegiate Scholars. This organization was founded on the principle that with scholarship comes a responsibility to obtain leadership and a duty to perform service. Habitat for Humanity was an organization that worked toward assisting in building houses, fund-raising to financially support the building and to educate people about the project. For more one-on-one involvement, Willamette students had several options. Best Buddies was a volunteer program designed to promote one-on-one friendships between college students and people with developmental disabilities. In the program, Willamette students and their buddies attended a Halloween and Christmas Dance, arts and crafts nights, a Chuck E. Cheese Party, and movie nights. Cartoon Club, which worked to offer students an opportunity to interact with children and parents staying at the Salem Outreach Center, was also a good place to develop such friendships. Students who wanted to work with children had several opportunities with Bush Elementary School located nearby. If they wanted to join a club connecting them with the school, they could either participate in Bush Mentor, a club that helped students find out about volunteer opportunities at Bush Elementary, or Outdoor Pursuits, an organization that provided low income, minority, and at-risk students the opportunity to learn about and experience the world of nature first-hand. For those students interested specifically in environmental issues, Roots and Shoots, a branch of the Jane Goodall Institute's environmental and humanitarian program, or the Environmental Community Outreach Society (ECOS), a club geared toward fostering environmental awareness, continuing environmental education, and providing environmental career opportunities, were the clubs they wanted to get involved in. There were many different ways students could get involved and serve the community this past year.

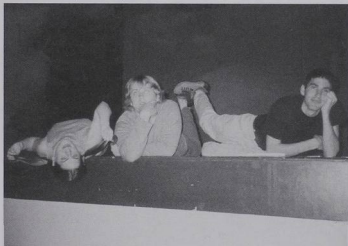

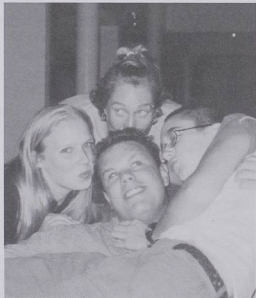

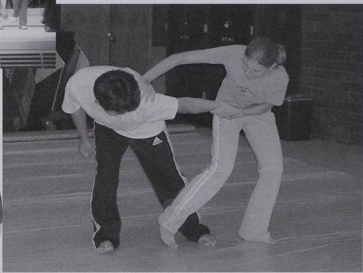

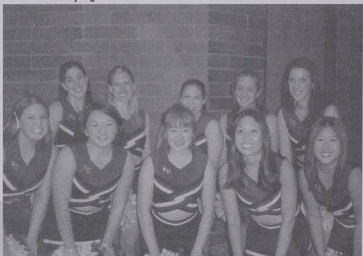

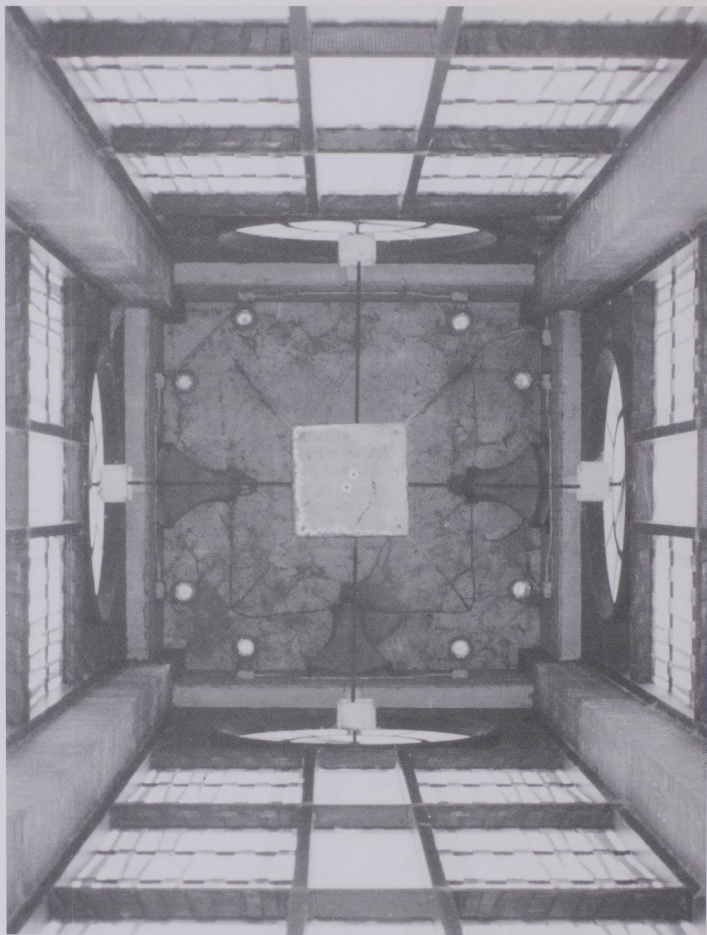

Despite finishing the regular season 16-2-1, being ranked No. 10 in the nation and tying for the Northwest Conference championship, the Willamette women's soccer team was not among the 45 teams selected for the NCAA Division III national tournament. Even though the lady bearcats beat two of the advancing teams earlier in the year (Chapman and Clarmont), Puget Sound won an automatic berth as conference champions (LPS beat WU on a head-to-head tiebreaker). Willamette had qualified

for the NCAA tournament in each year since moving to the NCAA in 1998. The Bearcats advanced to the Final Four in 1998 and 2001, and the Final Eight in 2000. Despite being robbed by the selection committee, the year was still a major success. Only three seniors graduated: Emily Kern, Shelby Springer and Laura Kunnert, so next year's team will look to continue their NWC dominance.

"So close,"

Senior Duncan Libby stated. The Willamette football (6-4, 3-2 NWC) team was so close to winning the Conference title and returning to the playoffs for the first time since 1995. But the Linfield defense came up with crucial plays at just the right moments to help the No. 7 Wildcats complete an undefeated regular season with a 32-20 Northwest Conference victory.

Even though the team did not advance to the playoffs, the season had many highlights. When Willamette rushed for 468

yards against Pacific Lutheran, it propelled the Bearcats to the top spot in NCAA Division III rushing with an average of 374.5 yard per game. In addition to leading the nation in rushing, Willamette was also ranked No. 9 in total offense (471.5) and scoring offense (41.8). Finally, Senior Drew Ecklund, who rushed for 1240 yards this season and 3900 total yards in his four years, became Willamette's new all-time leading rusher.

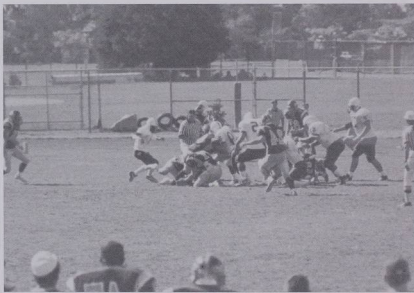

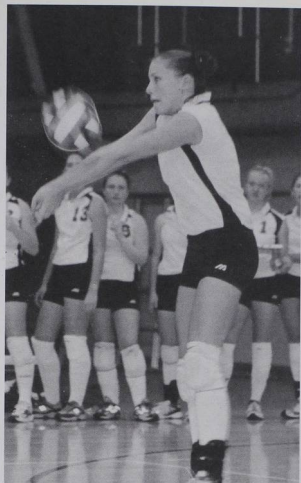

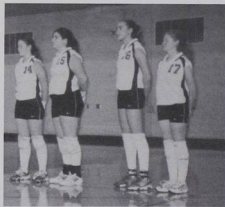

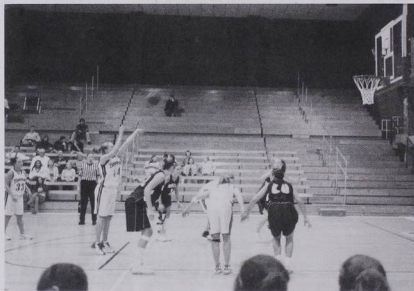
nents this year," said Steers.

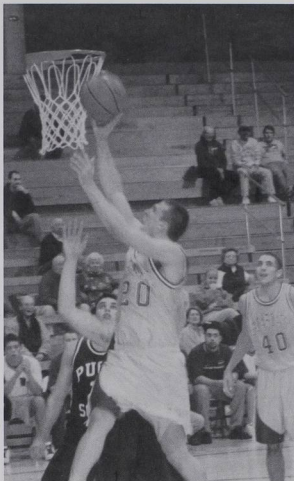

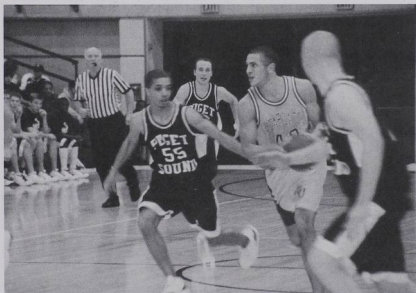


Title Run

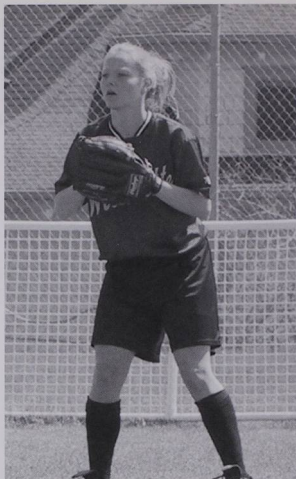
Winning

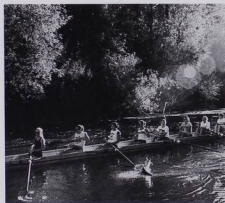

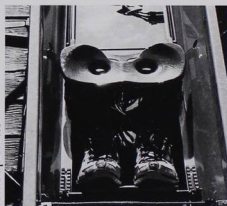
Rower retention has been a large problem for coach Rodney Mott in the past. However, this

Willamette University head coach Kelly Sullivan was part of a Bearcat track and field dynasty as an athlete. Now he could be creating one as coach. He directed Willamette to a sweep of the Northwest Conference track and field titles in 2002, the first Bearcat men's title since 1987 and the first women's crown since 1978.
