ARCHAEOLOGISTS MAKE FIRST COLORADO SURVEY

Denver, April 18.—Student archaeologists, under the direction of Dr. E. B. Renaud of the University of Denver, this summer will undertake what is said to be the first archaeological survey of Colorado ever attempted. Exposures of fossil bones which might have a bearing on the antiquity of man in America will be the object of special search. The expedition will leave Denver shortly after commencement and remain in the field at least two months. It is being financed by the University, the Colorado Museum of Natural History and the Smithsonian Institute, the latter defraying half the expenses. From four to six senior or graduate students will make the trip with Dr. Renaud. They will receive college credit for their work.

A few men of various classes may be impressed from the ranks of the baseball squad, and from among the bystanders, to participate in events which call for no great amount of training before hand. Nevertheless, most of the events will be limited to those who have been training regularly.

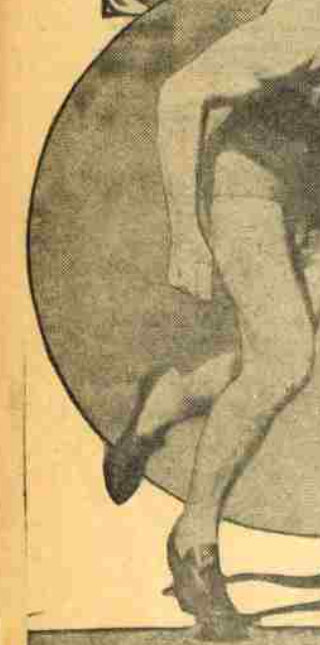
