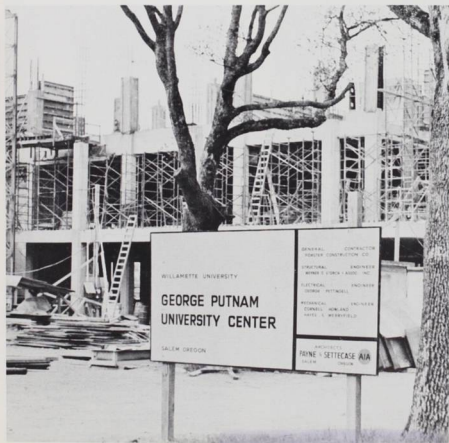
**Reflections. . . .**

But how can it be?*

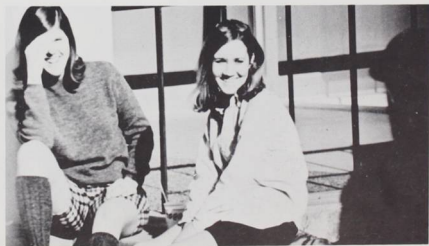




*Yes,

# Football

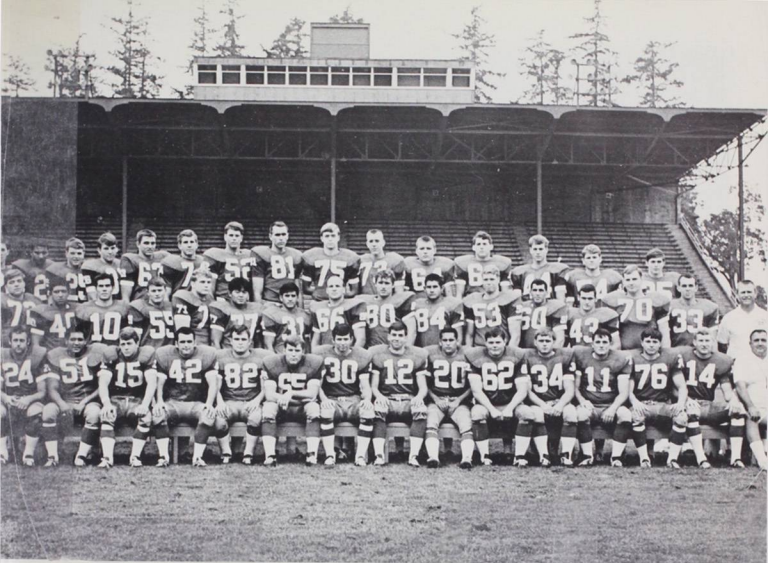
This year the Bearcats didn't have to share the Conference Crown with anybody. Willamette won the title with a perfect 6-0 record which included shut-out victories over arch-rivals Lewis and Clark and Linfield. Overall the Bearcats finished the regular season with an unblemished 9-0 mark. Among these were victories over such powerhouses as University of Nevada and University of Puget Sound. Post-season activity found the Bearcats rated third in the nation in the NAIA, which eventually led Willamette to Montgomery, Alabama, and the NAIA Championship Semi-Final Playoff Bowl against the Red Wave of Troy State. The Bearcats failed to hold their own this time and lost to the very powerful and strong team from the deep South.

Post-season awards and achievements were once again bestowed upon the Bearcat gridders and coaches. Ted Ogdahl in his seventeenth season became the number one coach in Willamette's history, compiling an 87-49-10 mark in 146 games. Player accomplishments were led by Cal Lee, who garnered 2nd Team All-American, All-Northwest, and All-Conference honors. Other All-Conference and All-Northwest players included Gib Gilmore, Tom Weathers, Jeff Knox, and Mike Shinn. Tom Williams was the other All-Conference Bearcat griddler.

Graduation will definitely deplete the Bearcat resources next season. The loss of Mike Shinn, who has virtually rewritten every possible record in the books, including career passing marks in yardage, attempts, completion, and total offence, is bound to hurt the offensive attack. Tiger Nicholson, out with an injured shoulder this season, will also retire from the Willamette football scene. His All-American ability will be greatly missed, as will Gib Gilmore's. Those are but three of the thirteen talented seniors departing from Willamette.

This season's fine performance will be hard to duplicate next year. With a rugged core of veterans, the fine blossoming of the many freshmen, and Ted Ogdahl's unexcelled recruiting ability, next season should once again be one of many rewarding victories. To the coaches and players of an exciting 1968 season, a job well done!

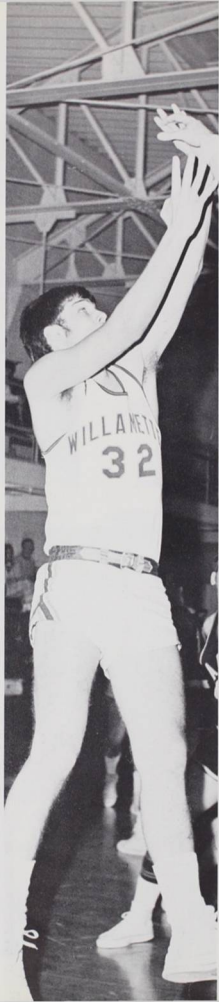
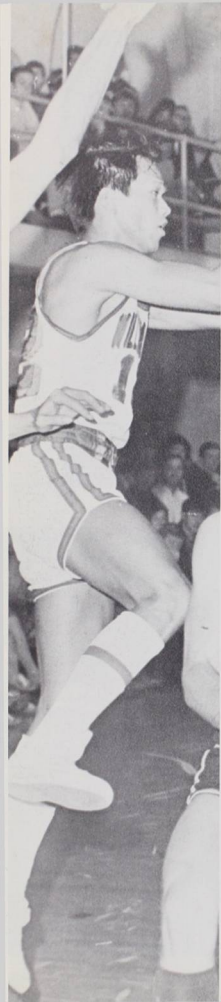


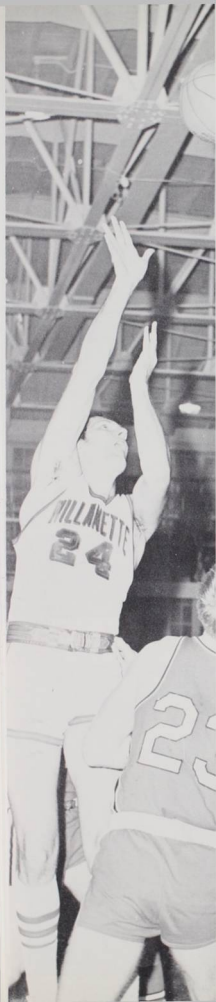
## Basketball

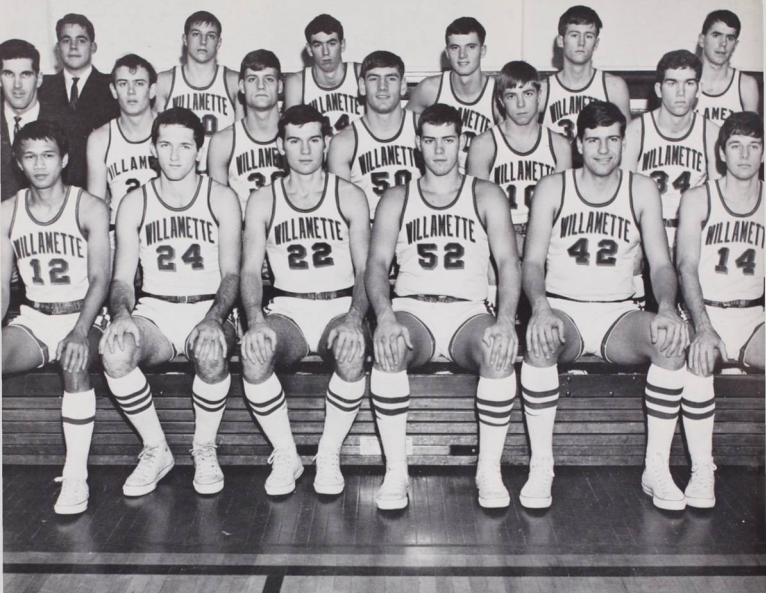
Once again the Bearcat Cagers of Coach Jim Boutin were in the thick of the NWC race, but when the final gun sounded, the Bearcats had finished in a tough, but highly respectable, third place. The Willamette University Cagers compiled an 11-7 conference record (one more win than last year) and a 14-12 over-all record (the same as last year). Coach Boutin stressed youth, as the season rapidly progressed by inserting freshmen Doug Holden and Dave Steen as starters, who responded magnificently to the Bearcat call. The Bearcats started quickly and streaked to 6-1 NWC record, behind the great efforts of John Barker, Sandy Marcelino, Super-Soph Bob Lundahl, and the two rookie starters. Linfield, however, managed to beat the Bearcats three times (once on a last second field goal), and suddenly it turned into a one team race. There were many bright spots in the season as a whole, however. Bob Lundahl, Willamette's tall center at 6'3", managed to break Willamette's rebounding record. Bob hit the boards for 321 rebounds, breaking the old mark by 3. He also garnered first team All-Conference, the only unanimous decision by the elite group. Accompanying him in post season laurels were seniors John Barker and Sandy Marcelino, who both earned second team All-Conference honors. These two seniors, as well as Jim George (the John Havlicek of the Bearcats) and Bob Schlegel, all performed as leading veterans should, and their absence will, indeed, be hard to replace. Next year's prospects will be centered around Steen, Holden, Lundahl, and a fine group of this year's freshmen J.V. players advancing into the varsity ranks. The Bearcats will be striving to break out of the "just over 500 barrier" next season, and, with some more excellent recruiting and this year's returnees, that barrier may well be broken.

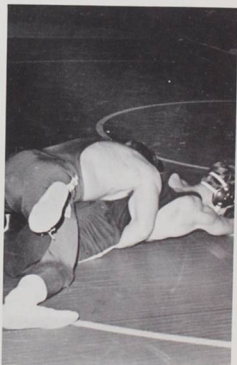
## Wrestling





The Willamette University wrestling team once again failed to field an entire squad and consequently suffered a depressing 20 point forfeiture per wrestling match. The Bearcats did not have the 115, 137, 167, 191 pound positions filled much to the disappointment of head Coach Joe Schaffeld. In spite of this gloomy fact the Bearcats did quite well in actual matches wrestled. Outstanding performances were turned in by veteran grapplers Bob Mial (152 pounds, 3rd in Conference, 4th in District) and Ian Fulp (177 pounds, 1st in Conference).

Ian fought to an impressive 14-1 won-lost record while Bob was 9-3. Other Conference placers included Danny Green 2nd (145), Doug McCabe 4th (123) and Larry Ramsey 4th (heavy weight). Carl Lopez (160) and Rich Huddleston (130) also turned in excellent performances for the Bearcat cause. Coach Schaffeld will undoubtedly be on the recruiting road in an all-out effort to rectify this seemingly perpetual and somewhat dismal situation. Next years hopes will rest in the returning veterans and the expectant results of coach Schaffeld's efforts.



# Swimming

Under the guidance of Coach David Nowicki, the Bearcat swimmers upheld their fine standings in both the Northwest Conference and the NAIA District II leagues. Although the times around the polls were the best on record in the history of Northwest swimming, the Bearcats kept their standard of excellence an imposing power to their opponents. The swimmers were led through their short season by the power-duo, Duffy Lederman and Glenn Knitter, who were elected Co-Captains by last years team. Glenn set a new school record in the 100 yd. backstroke while starting a Medley Relay. The two remaining graduating seniors, Chris McKenzie and Tom Staible gave immense strength to the Individual Medley and to Breaststroke, respectively. ## Soccer



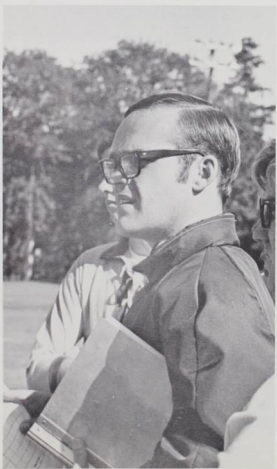

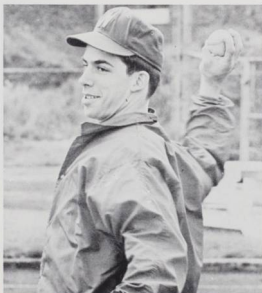
# Baseball

BEARCAT BASEBALLERS CAPTURE NORTHWEST CONFERENCE CROWN. To the pleasant surprise of everyone including head-coach John Lewis and excepting conference opponents, the Willamette University Bearcats confidently captured the Northwest Conference Baseball Crown, compiling an impressive 12-3 conference record beating out arch-rival Linfield. The Bearcats jumped off to a 9-0 conference start before faltering their perfect record in a two game set with none other than Linfield. This year's young club was led by all-NAIA district player of the year, sophomore Roger Herm. Herm compiled 1-62 ERA in league play while posing an impressive 5-1 conference record. Others included freshman Pete Fern, all-NWC, all-district second baseman. Fern carved a 426 batting average, five home runs, and 28 RBI's, all Bearcat bests. Other outstanding performances by Willamette University players included Dave Bloye, also all-NWC and all-district. Bloye had 25 runs, 29 hits, and 11 stolen bases, also all Bearcat highs.
