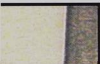
Opening Days leaders gave them a taste of campus life. O.D. activities ranged from dances and games to serious discussions about college lifestyle.

Theme parties play a definitive role in college life. At WU there are a variety of unique get-togethers.

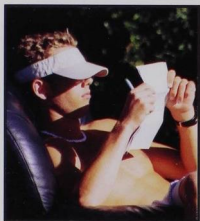

Halloween is traditionally an activity that receives a lot of student attention on campus; this year was no different. Students dressed up and showed that Halloween is not just for little kids!

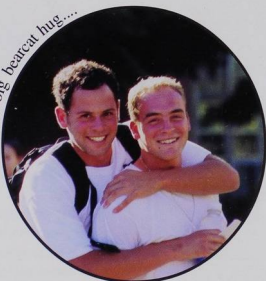

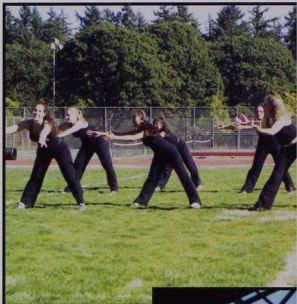

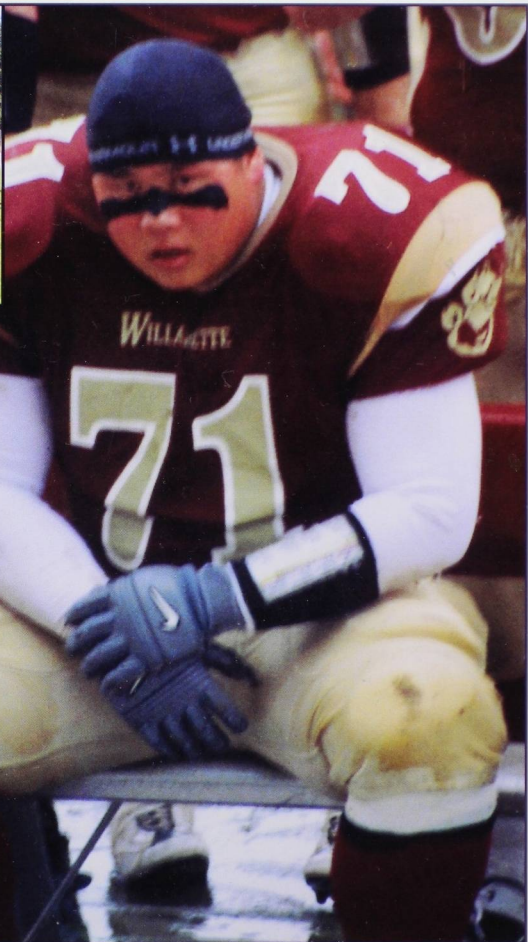

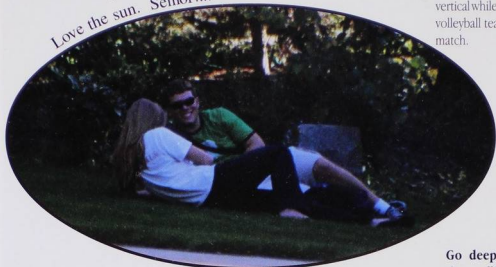

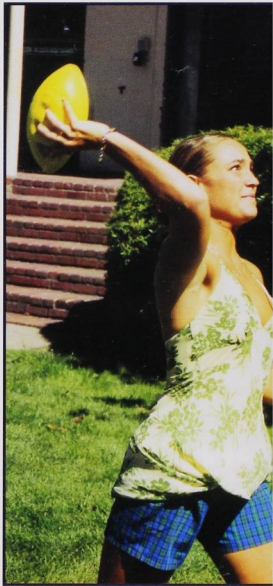

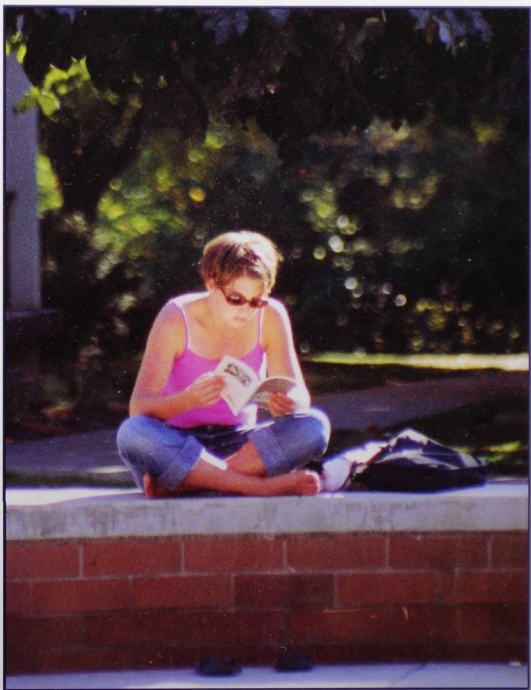

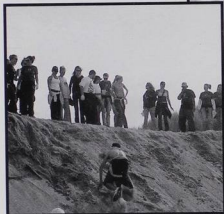


# Standing behind the community

**Into the Streets.** The Community Outreach office sponsors one day a semester, in which students help a variety of local non-profit organizations.



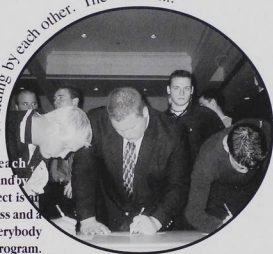

# RUN, RUN, RUN. CROSS COUNTRY

And run, run, run the Bearcats runners did. At practice, at races, at Nationals, and into the records book.

The men's team, primarily consisting of freshmen and sophomores, and only one junior had no official captains. The responsibilities fell onto the able shoulders of sophomores Jacob Stout, Aaron Young and Nathan O'Brien. The team set a goal in the beginning of the season to place within the top 10 at Nationals. At the end of the season, the team placed 7th at nationals, with Stout placing 5th with a time of 24:25 and Young placing 27th with a time of 24:51 for 5,000m. Both of them earned All American honors for finishing within the top 35 runners. This was their second trip to Nationals.

Along the way to Nationals, the men's team also won the conference title. That very same day, the men's head coach, Matt McGuirk, was also honored. In his third year as head coach, he was named the men's conference coach of the year. According to the coach, the successes of this year's season doesn't end there, the men's team also had an "amazingly well set of freshmen, who set lofty goals and exceeded them."

The men's team will be looking forward to another year of great success since 10 of the top 15 runners in the conference will be graduating. It'll put many of the runners on the men's team in good company on top.

On the women's team, this season has been their third time in four years that they have placed no lower than 2nd place in the conference. Only one of their runners went to Nationals, and it was sophomore Liz Rodda. This was her second trip to Nationals.

Two of her teammates also earned all conference honors. They were junior Nattalie Wright, and freshmen Alicia Andrews. Both of them finished within half a minute of Rodda's finishing time of 18:25 for 3,000m.

Both teams look primed for another stellar year, and Willamette can't wait to celebrate with the team on their successes.

# FINAL FOUR WOMEN'S SOCCER

The Willamette women's soccer team came into the season looking to improve on the quarterfinal appearance the year before in the postseason. As coach Jim Tursi said, "Coming into the season our goal was to make the final four. We had come close the year before and we had the talent to go that far into the playoffs this year." Whether or not the Bearcats would make the playoffs came down to the last game of the season against archrival Puget Sound. The Loggers had upset the Bearcats earlier in the season 1-0 and now Willamette was looking for some revenge. With the conference title and an automatic berth into the playoffs on the line the two teams battled on a wet and soggy Sparks Field. With just under ten minutes to

play the Bearcat's leading scorer senior Buffy Morris took a shot just outside the penalty box that sailed over the goalkeeper's outstretched arms and into the net for the only goal of the game.

The Bearcat's hosted the first two rounds of the playoffs and had no problem disposing of their opponents. In the regional semi-finals the Bearcats defeated Lawrence College 5-0 and then on the following day in the regional finals the Bearcats took care of the University of Redlands 3-1. The next weekend Willamette hosted Lynchburg College of Virginia in an NCAA quarterfinal match. After a tough first half the Bearcats came out strong and defeated them 2-0 to advance to the final four. Willamette traveled to Ohio to play Ohio Wesleyan University at home and came up just a little short losing 2-1 in overtime to the eventual champions.

Once again the Bearcats had another strong run to reach the playoffs. They went through the entire regular season with only one loss and led the league in scoring. First team nominations this year included senior midfielder, Morris, sweeper Karen Heaston and sophomore forward Anne Merten. Junior midfielder Emily Kern set the Willamette record for most assists in a season and also made second team in the Northwest Conference. Newcomer Nicole Dahl had a strong season and earned honorable mention in the conference.

Next year the Bearcats will miss seniors Heaston, Morris, Heather Ebert and Ashley Holmer, but will once again look to have another strong season.

# STRONG START

## MEN'S SOCCER

Once again the Willamette men's soccer team fielded a young team made up mostly of freshmen and sophomores. The team was led by its lone senior and co-captain sweeper Tim Kenyon who said when reflecting on the season, "we got off to a great start, but then let it all slip away towards the end of the season."

To start the season the Bearcats came out strong with a 6-2 record. Due to the events on September 11 the Bearcats had their preseason trip to California cancelled along with several other games. Despite the setback the team played well in its two games before conference play started. They defeated Trinity Western from Canada 1-0 in a game that would not count because the team was not from the United States. The team then defeated cross town rival Western Baptist 4-2.

Conference play started out with a tough 3-1 loss to Linfield before the Bearcats won five of their next seven games. They defeated Whitman College 1-0, Pacific University 1-0, George Fox 2-0 and Puget Sound 1-0. After a tough 3-2 loss to Pacific Lutheran in double overtime the Bearcats beat George Fox again 2-1 in overtime. The fast start put the Bearcats at second place in the league and right in contention for the conference title. Unfortunately things fell apart for the men's soccer team toward the end of the season as the limped to the finished line with a 1-4 record to end the season.

Despite the setbacks there were several bright spots for the team during the season. Freshman goalie Andrew Ward earned Player

of the Week honors for shutting out both George Fox and Pacific in the same weekend. Junior Michael Semenza earned first team all-conference and sophomore Adam Moshofsky earned second team all-conference. Also junior Mike Ott and freshman Kyle Gouviea earned honorable mention. Sophomore Ben DeSanno led the team in scoring with six goals and fellow sophomore and forward Ricardo Sanchez finished second in the conference and led the team with nine assists.

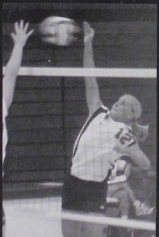

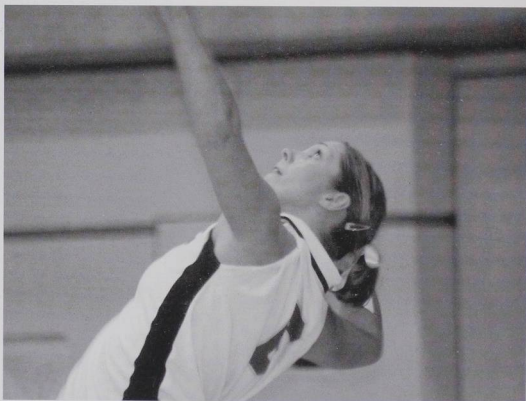

With 17 players on the team this year, the Bearcats had one of the larger teams in the conference. But it was not a matter of quantity, but of quality, to have a winning team. Without a dominating hitter for the volleyball team again this year, the Bearcats ended the season with an overall record of 7-14 and a seventh place conference record of 4-12.

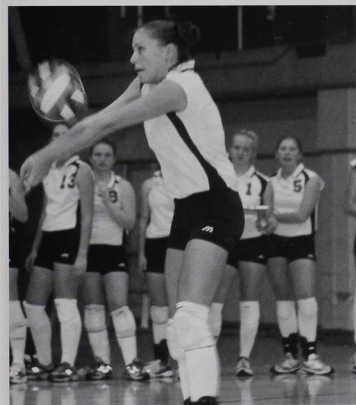

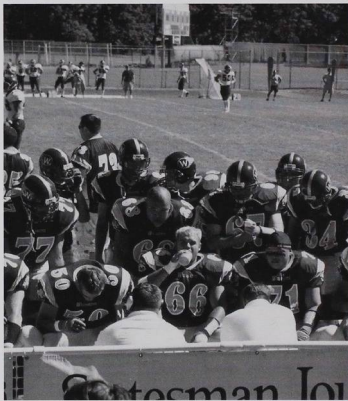
vicotry to the opposing teams again. With a potential of 16 starters eligible to return next year, these mistakes will no long hinder the Bearcats.

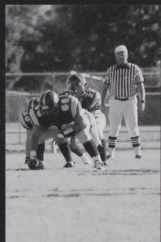

The Willamette men's lacrosse team is back for their second season of action. The Bearcats are looking to improve upon last year's team that had just three players with previous experience and managed only one win. This year's edition has twenty two players on the team including ten returning players. As returning sophomore goalie and co-captain Keith Bondaug says, "I am supremely confident we will be successful this season." The Bearcats are coached by sophomore Nick Christianson who also plays on the team. He is helped out by the other co-captain on the team Pat Kabealo. The Lacrosse team is considered a club team and receives its support from ASWU. As Kabealo says, "ASWU has given us a lot of financial support this year."

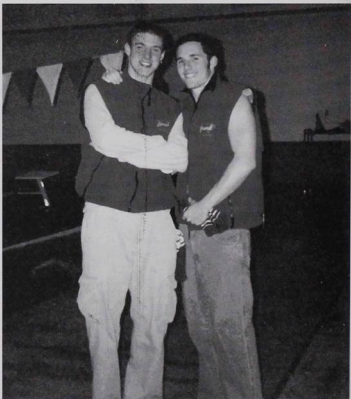

Despite an 11-14 season overall, 6-10 in conference, many of the players concluded that the season went pretty well. One of the problems the team faced was being undersized. "We were a little disappointed with where we ended up in the league, 7th place, but this was a learning year."

With no seniors on the team this year, everyone on the team is expected to return next year. "Next year I feel that we'll do really well. We're returning with all of our players and the league is losing a lot of the top players. I'm very excited about the upcoming year!," sophomore guard Wenchi Liu said. Contri adds in, "The graduation of the leagues top players will give us an edge because we have the same amount, or even better talent coming. Watch out for the Bearcats in 2003!! We will be a force to reckon with."

Junior Rosie Contri made it to the NWC honorable mention list by leading the Bearcats in points, rebounding, minutes and steals.

# BREAKOUT YEAR

## MEN'S BASKETBALL

The 2001-2002 men's basketball season will always be remembered for the Bearcats travelling down to Eugene to play the twenty-second ranked team in the nation, the University of Oregon. The two teams faced off in commemoration of the 75th anniversary of McArthur Court. The game was played in front of over 8,000 fans and televised on ESPN 2. The Bearcats looked to extend their winning streak against Oregon to two games having beaten them 53-44 the last time the two teams met 53 years ago. Willamette came out strong in the first half, unintimidated by the Ducks, and took the lead early in the game 6-4. The Ducks eventually rebounded, however, and went on to win 71-48. Despite the loss the Bearcats would go on to finish the season at 18-8 and come within one game of winning the conference title.

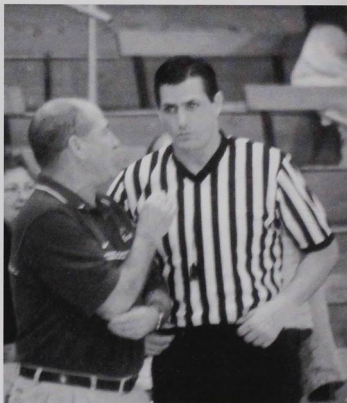
The run for the NWC title began after the Oregon game when the Bearcats went on a seven game winning streak in the conference. The Bearcats defeated Puget Sound, Pacific, Linfield, Whitworth, Whitman, Pacific Lutheran and George Fox before falling to Lewis and Clark. During the winning streak the Bearcats earned a number twenty five national ranking in D3hoops.com, the first time the men's basketball program has been ranked nationally since moving to Division III.

Despite the winning streak the season came to a sudden end with consecutive losses to Lewis and Clark and Puget Sound. This set up a playoff game against Whitworth, where once again the Bearcats couldn't find their winning touch from earlier in the season and lost 64-49. As sophomore David Force said, "we had a

great season, the ball just didn't bounce our way at the end."

Picked to finish in the middle of the conference the Bearcats showed a lot of people wrong and were justly rewarded for their efforts. In January junior B.J. Dobrkovsky was named Conference Player of the Week. Also Coach Gordie James was named Conference Coach of the Year and juniors Marques Johnson and Ryan Hepp were named first team all conference.

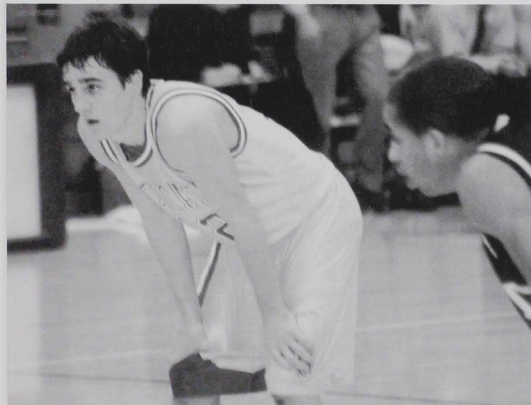

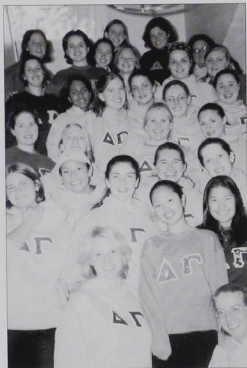

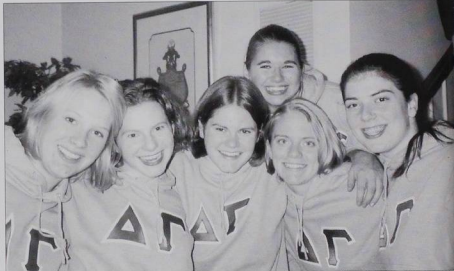

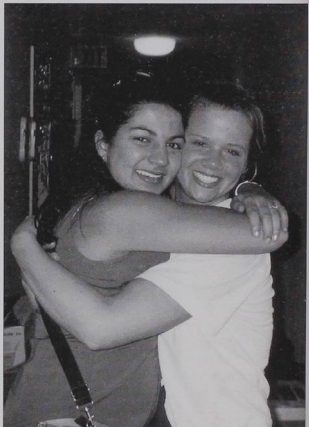

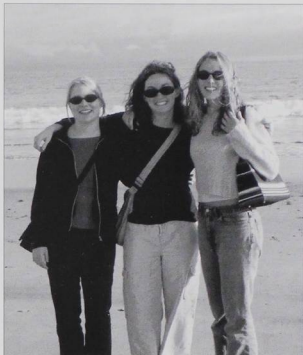

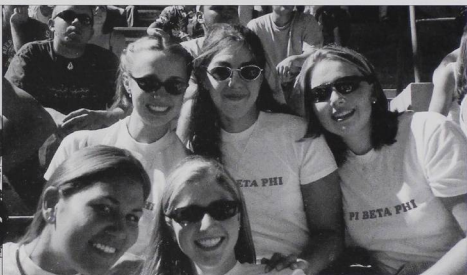

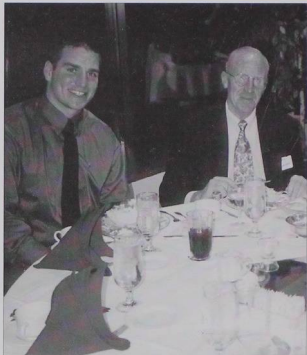

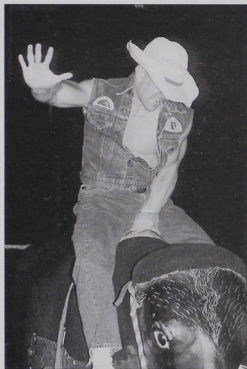

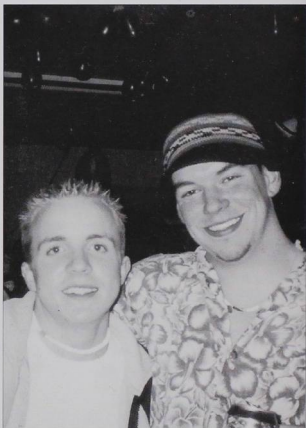

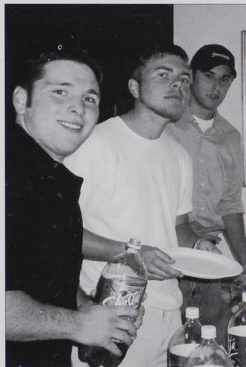

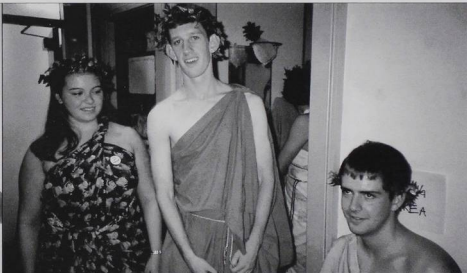

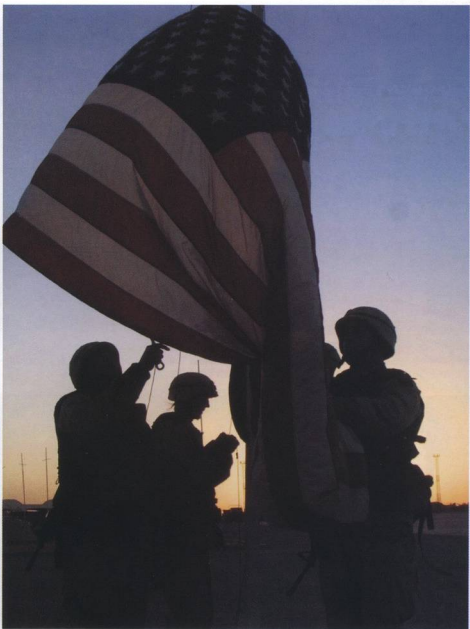

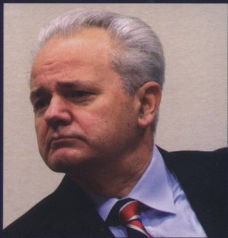

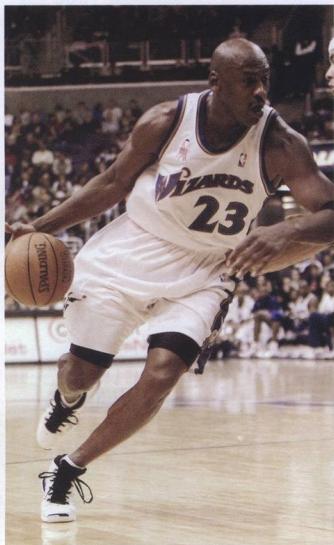

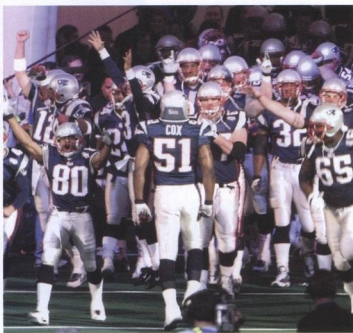

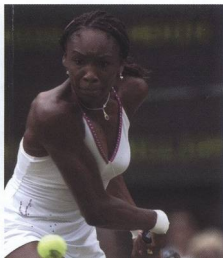

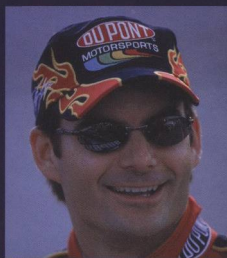

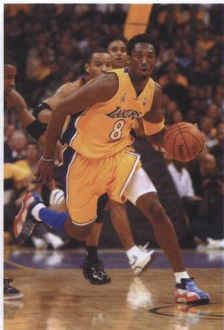

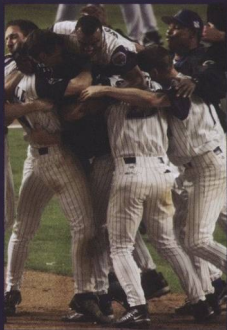

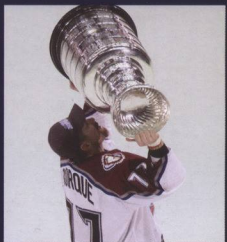

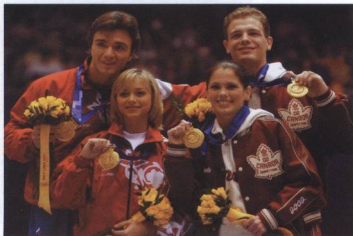
