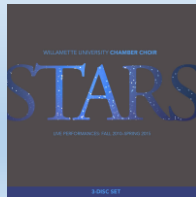

Eamon Gover:

Eamon Gover is a jazz saxophonist who hails from Glencoe, Illinois, one of the northern suburbs of Chicago. With a guitarist for a dad and a music-lover for a mom, the soundtrack of his childhood prominently featured the Beatles, Louis Prima, Carl Perkins, and Dexter Gordon. He first picked up the saxophone as a fifth grader, and has since added a few other instruments along the way. Between playing in jazz groups at New Trier High School during the school week and at Midwest Young Artists Conservatory on the weekends, he received plenty of opportunities to share his music, culminating in participation at the Illinois Music Education Conference, a Louis Armstrong Award, and the chance to be a featured soloist as part of New Trier Jazz Ensemble One's opening set for Arturo O'Farrill and the Afro-Latin Jazz Orchestra at Birdland in New York. Like countless Midwesterners before him, however, Eamon decided to make the trip westward to Oregon. Two years later, Eamon has found a niche among Willamette's music community.

A member of the WU Jazz Collective since his first day, he was given the opportunity of a lifetime to collaborate with the Willamette Singers, going on tour with them and recording for Image on Image as a first-year. After joining the group full-time as a sophomore, Eamon feels right at home among the highly-talented vocalists and fellow instrumentalists he's gotten the pleasure to play with thus far. He looks forward to making more music with his friends and colleagues!
