You know, on second thought, perhaps Lausanne is a bit different. And don't ever forget it.

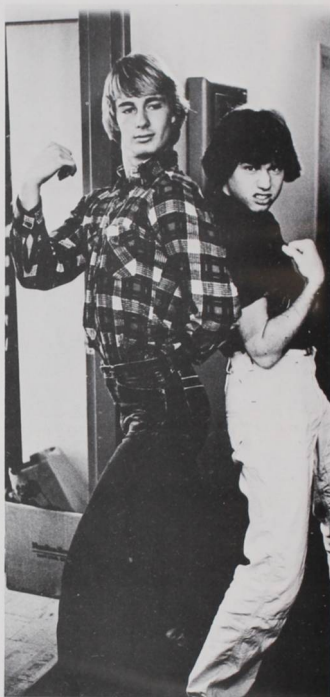

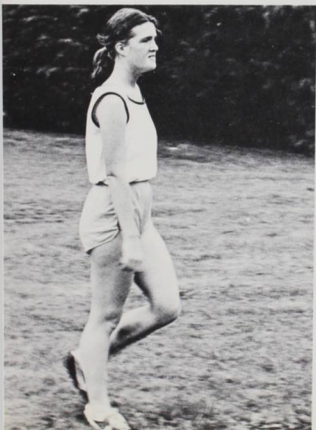


CROSS COUNTRY

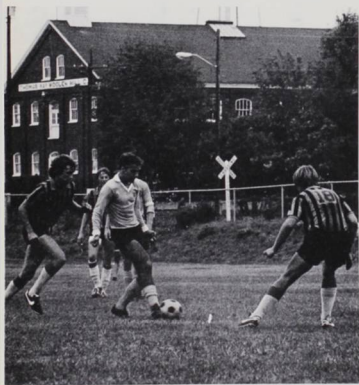

BASKETBALL



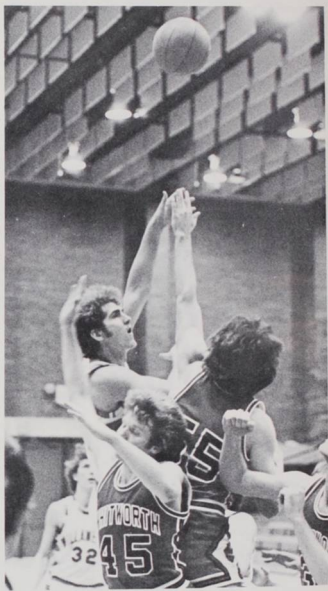

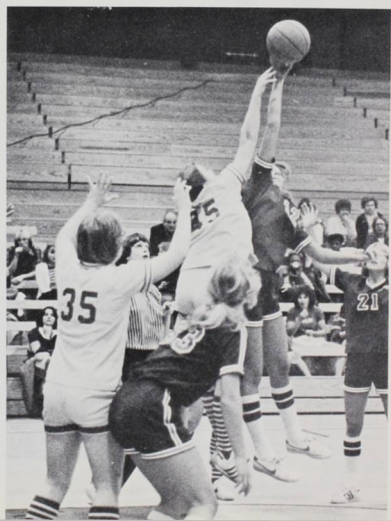
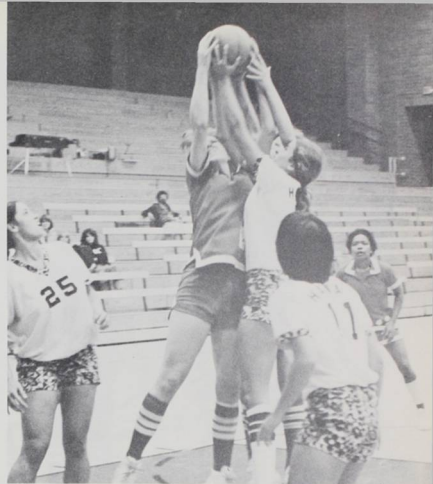


The women's basketball team won the WCIC title for the first time since 1975. Their league record was 6-2, their overall record was 15-7, and their small college record was 15-4.

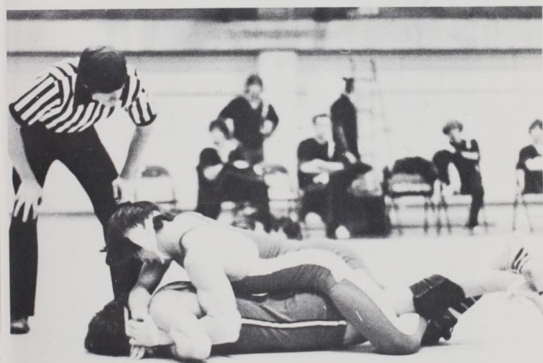


WRESTLING

"Cosi fan tutti" was performed for the first time on January 26, 1790 in Vienna. It is a satire on the fidelity of women. The work belongs to the buffa, comic, genre at which Mozart excelled. The story is set in Naples during the 18th century.

Don Alfonso a cynical bachelor, makes a bet that he can prove to his two young friends, Guiglielmo and Ferrando, that their fiancées are not to be trusted. With the help of Despina, the ladies's servant, Don Alfonso lays his plot. First he informs Dorabella and Fiordiligi that Guiglielmo and Ferrando have been sent off to war; later he introduces the girls to two "Albanians" who are, in fact, the young men in disguise. After several conflicts the two women give in to the "Albanians's" advances. Having won the bet, Don Alfonso reveals the plot and all ends happily.

Editor's Note: The following article was reproduced from the February first issue of the *Collegian*. Jeff Swanson requested that it be included as his summation of the 1978 year.

After scanning through a few old *Collegians*, I tried to recap the important events that transpired during the past year. I saw that we cut funding for the second newspaper, the *Mill Stream*; we debated the Russian major issue, which ended in a compromise favoring the administrative position; we worked with the Minority Action Committee to recommend an increase in Willamette's cultural diversity; we hosted the Tower of Power band, who played to a small audience and mixed reviews; we complained about the usage of Putnam Center, calling it an administrative enclave and community center for non-Willamette people rather than the student center it was designed to be; we transferred \$10,000 of ASWU funds to a new checking account so as to improve the service we pay the business office to render, but following a major battle, we were forced to compromise and now we need to look at the procedure once again to streamline the operation; finally, we supported the controversial Coalition Against Apartheid, who won a victory with the Trustees at last Friday's meeting.

There were other activities that filled in the days, but I think that is a review of our major work. As for suggestions for the future...

- 1.) Dr. Lisensky should try to develop a better rapport with the students of this relatively small campus.
- 2.) Students want to be involved in the decision-making process from the conception of an idea. Administrators should be more conscious of this fact.

3.) It should be realized that the investment portfolio of this University is not a political tool, but rather an economic reality. Discussions should be free and unrestricted on campus, and we should all take on the question of social responsibility, but it is not our role to play with the University's endowment. The conservative people in power can get irritated on this matter, to the detriment of the University.

4.) Students should expect higher standards from administrators, professors, ASWU officers and senators, publications and facilities. The price paid is too high to expect otherwise.

Finally I would like to thank Benji Bradford, Andy Gala, Nita DeMaris, Shawn Holt, Marge Patton, Alme Harrison, Bob Lisensky, Larry Large, and Jerry Berberet for making this year one that I won't soon forget. And to our new officers, Liz Geiger, John Gallagher, Kerry Tymchuk, and Tanya Murray, I wish you the best of luck. We should all remember that our association's leadership is only as good in that capacity as the demands and expectations that are placed upon them by their constituents.

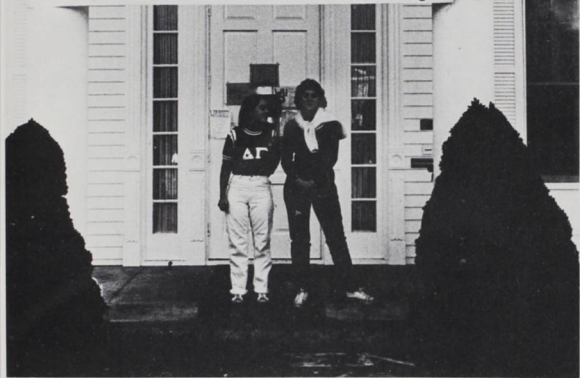
