All too often, we find universities described as "teaching" schools or "research" institutions, as though these two activities cannot coexist in a single domain. Willamette, though, proudly defies such expectations. Hailed as one of the "Colleges That Change Lives" for its commitment to teaching, strong mentorship,

and holistic approach to student learning, Willamette is equally deserving of recognition for the achievements of its faculty beyond the classroom.

As the contents of this booklet make clear, the faculty of the College of Liberal Arts are just as dedicated to their scholarly and creative pursuits as they are to their pedagogy — and, moreover, just as successful in these endeavors. The collective output of two years represented in these pages is prodigious: some fifteen books; four albums of music; twenty-two reviews and translations; well over a hundred exhibitions, performances, and productions; and close to two hundred articles, chapters, poems, essays, and works of short fiction. Willamette scholars and artists were successful in securing almost fifty external grants, ranging from a few thousand dollars to multiple hundreds of thousands, and were recognized for their scholarly work, leadership, or teaching by awards from numerous professional associations, cultural institutions, and other organizations.

Even more impressive than this simple numerical list, however, is the range of intellectual interests and creative avenues that Willamette faculty explore. From the representation of disability in English renaissance literature, to the fate of estrogens in sewage-impacted waterways, to shadow banking in China, our faculty research ranges across the globe, across history, and across disciplinary boundaries. Often, it directly involves students, incorporating their contributions and recognizing them as co-authors; in other cases, it informs teaching, bringing new ideas and energies to the classroom. I defy anyone reading through this booklet not to find at least one item mentioned that piques your interest, and makes you want to learn more. And I encourage you to follow through on that impulse: to read, or watch, or listen to something you hadn't encountered before, and learn something you didn't know. And then go talk to that piece's creator — ask questions, share your ideas, or just express your admiration. We have a marvelous community of scholars and artists here at Willamette — let's recognize and celebrate it.
