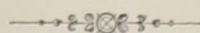

## Miscellaneous Information.

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### COLLEGE EDIFICE.

For the last thirteen years the University has occupied the building formerly used as a Mission school; but the growing wants of the community have prompted the erection of a beautiful and commodious brick edifice, which is an ornament to the State of Oregon. It is four stories high, in the shape of a Greek cross, eighty-four feet each way—the wings being of forty-four feet front. It is surmounted by a neat cupola. The building is expected to accommodate four hundred students. It is now being finished inside and plastered, and there is reasonable hope of being able to use a portion of it at the beginning of the ensuing collegiate year. The special contributions of friends have nearly paid for it thus far, and it is hoped will continue until it is as thoroughly furnished as any college in the older States.

The University has lately received a grant of the Mission property in and around Salem, which, with its endowments in the form of scholarship notes, secures its permanence and places it in the front rank of educational institutions on the Pacific coast.

### APPARATUS, ETC.

The University is furnished with a very full and excellent set of philosophical apparatus, and arrangements are



being made to supply a superior astronomical telescope, as well as a laboratory for chemical and metallurgical investigations. The library already numbers several hundred volumes, and is steadily increasing. The Smithsonian Institution at Washington have contributed an educational series of specimens in conchology; which, with a number of minerals and fossils, make up a very respectable cabinet of Natural History. As soon as the new buildings are finished, the arrangement of these specimens will be both ornamental and useful. Contributions of specimens are expected from various localities.

#### SOCIETIES.

Literary societies in both the Male and Female Departments afford opportunities for intellectual culture.

#### DISCIPLINE AND RELIGIOUS INFLUENCE.

The Primary, Intermediate, Academical and Preparatory Departments are so graded that students will be under the observation and control of the teacher during school hours, and a general supervision will be had over the higher classes. The principle of moral suasion is regarded as the basis of discipline. Refractory pupils are subject to reproof or suspension by the Faculty, and the worst cases, to expulsion. An account of each recitation is made, and at the close of the term an average is taken. Ten is assumed as the maximum, and indicates an excellence to which students rarely attain. One falling below five cannot advance with the class. A public examination will be held at the close of each term, and a special examination on the topics of the course for the candidates for diplomas.

The University is under the patronage of the Oregon Conference of the M. E. Church, but is by no means a sectarian institution. While care is taken to exert a healthful moral and religious influence, no sectarian bias is allowed. Students

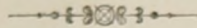
are required to be at morning prayers in the chapel, and those of the Collegiate and Preparatory Departments to attend some place of divine worship, and a lecture on the Scriptures in the University chapel, on the Sabbath. Unexcused absence from these receives a demerit mark, as in the case of neglect of recitations or literary exercises.
