

THE QUALITY of the work being done by *Willamette University* has been recognized by the chief accrediting organizations of the country. The University is on the approved list of the Association of American Universities, being one of the three independent colleges of the Northwest to receive this recognition. It has been approved by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. It is a member of the American Association of University Women. It meets the requirements for teaching certificates in four-year high schools as adopted by the Conference of the Chief State School Officers of the North Central and West Central States, and the requirements for certification in Oregon, Washington and Idaho.



A SMALL COLLEGE

The ideal enrollment of *WILLAMETTE UNIVERSITY* is placed at five hundred, the freshman class being limited each year to two hundred. The facilities provided for the handling of this student group are entirely favorable.

The physical plant consists of a campus of eighteen acres, upon which are located seven buildings, athletic fields and stadium. These are located in the heart of the city of Salem and directly opposite the State Capitol.

There is approximately one full-time instructor to each fifteen students enrolled.

WILLAMETTE UNIVERSITY is particularly fortunate in its library facilities (the heart of a university). In addition to the University libraries of 30,000 volumes, students have access to the Oregon State Library of 290,000 volumes, the Salem City Library of 25,000 volumes and the Oregon Supreme Court Library of 48,000 volumes.

Extra Curricular Activities

MUSIC,

Glee Clubs are maintained for men and women. A light opera is presented annually. Nationally known artists are presented in concert. The Beethoven Society encourages student public appearances.

FORENSICS,

Willamette University is a member of the Pacific Coast Forensic League. Intercollegiate Debate, Oratory and Extemporaneous Speaking contests are engaged in at home and abroad and are student activities of major importance. Tau Kappa Alpha, national forensic fraternity, has a chapter at Willamette.

Three standard plays are produced annually at Willamette. The Speech Department conducts a Little Theatre. A local chapter of Theta Alpha Phi, national dramatics fraternity, has been established.

PUBLICATIONS,

The student body of *Willamette University* publishes a weekly paper, "The Collegian."

"The Wallulah" is the annual volume published by the student body. Members of the staff may be elected to Beta Chi Alpha, College annual fraternity.

DEPARTMENTAL CLUBS,

The Classical Club, French Club, Science Club, Shakespeare Club, Writers' Club, Home Economics Club and the social science fraternity of Pi Gamma Mu, are devoted to departmental interests.

A BALANCED CURRICULUM

The curriculum of *Willamette University* is a dynamic ever-developing project. At present the student may major in any one of twenty-one departments which represent the main fields of human knowledge and research. Through faculty groupings a correlation of the desired objectives in each field is being attained.

THE FACULTY

THE FACULTY of *Willamette University* consists of thirty-six instructors and a group of thirteen have attained the doctorate and sixteen have the Master's degree. Ohio State, Iowa, Northwestern, Illinois, California, New York, Harvard, Yale, Cornell, Columbia and other American institutions have conferred degrees on members of this faculty. Individuals in the learned societies, their articles appearing in the society journals from time to time. Twenty-six are listed in "Who's Who in America."

ADMISSION

Graduation from a standard high school is necessary for admission to the University, but such graduation does not insure admission. Only those are admitted whose high school work has been largely in English, mathematics, foreign languages, history and science; who rank in the upper half of the high school class; who are of good character and can present evidence of clear purpose and high ideals. Blank forms for use in making application for admission may be obtained from the Registrar. These give the needed information as to requirements and should be filled out and filed with the Registrar as soon as possible after the close of the first semester of the senior year, for the University is obliged each year to refuse admission to a considerable number since the total enrollment is limited to about five hundred at any one time.

ALUMNI

Willamette University has approximately 1200 living alumni. Numbered among these is a considerable group of the distinguished citizens of the Northwest. Loyal and useful Alumni in all parts of the world testify as to the influence of their Alma Mater. The bar, the bench, medicine, education, journalism, engineering, business, the ministry, farming and governmental service—all have recruited their ranks from the graduating classes of *Willamette*.

SORORITY

The University sororities—Alpha, Beta Chi, Delta Psi Delta, Kappa Gamma—maintains a house in the Wolvorton Section. The Sorority of Delta Theta Gamma of Daleth Teth Gimel fell of Daleth Teth Gimel in fall of 1928.

HISTORY

Early in the summer of 1834, Jason Lee and his party pitched camp in the Oregon country and soon after opened a mission school. Ten years later, its successor, the Oregon Institute, was opened on the present campus of *Willamette*. The original building is gone but its site is marked by a boulder monument.

This little mission was a nucleus about which clustered the early trade and cultural aspirations of the pioneers. By 1852, the pioneer village was of sufficient importance to attract to it the state capital, the capitol literally dividing with the University its beautiful natural park. Today, the University faces the state capitol, before which stands the statute of the circuit rider, emblematic of the sturdy Christian spirit of the founders.



ATHLETICS

Intramural athletics are maintained under the personal supervision of the Director of Physical Education and the Chairman of the Interclass Rivalry Committee.


SORORITIES AND FRATERNITIES
