Medical Department.

The Trustees take pleasure in announcing to the Physicians and citizens of the Pacific coast that they have succeeded in making permanent arrangements for regularly organized Medical Lectures, to be given in connection with the Willamette University.

The second session will commence on the 4th day of November, 1867. Clinical instructions will be given twice a week. Operations performed in presence of the class. Material for dissection and anatomical demonstration will be provided, and all the necessary means to facilitate the study of Anatomy.

Requirements for Graduation are as follows: The candidate must be twenty-one years of age, and must present proper testimonials of a good moral character, and satisfactory evidence of having studied Medicine three years (Lectures included) with a reputable practitioner of Medicine. He must have attended two full courses of Lectures, the last of which must have been in the Medical Department of the Willamette University. He must pass a satisfactory examination in the presence of a committee appointed by the Trustees, and submit to the Faculty an acceptable thesis on some medical subject, in his own handwriting.

Graduates from other Medical Colleges in good standing are required to matriculate only.

Good board may be obtained on terms more reasonable than in any other city on the Pacific coast.

Students, on arriving in the city, are requested to call on the Dean, who will see that they are provided with accommodations, and will give any other information that they may desire.

Letters addressed to the Dean, or any member of the Faculty, will receive prompt attention.

Miscellaneous Information.

From a Mission school, long continued under the name of the Oregon Institute, this institution has grown to be a University, and for fourteen years a course of collegiate and academical study has been pursued under its present charter. Its list of alumni will compare favorably with any on the Pacific coast. During the past year, the Trustees organized a Medical Department, which just concludes a successful term of four months' instruction, with twenty students. They have also arranged for a Theological Department, to commence at the next regular term, and to continue during the same period as the academical course. The gratuitous labor of ministers of well known standing is relied on to make this a success. It is designed to have a Law Department also, so that the young men of Oregon and the Pacific Coast need be under no necessity of incurring the expense and labor of going to the Eastern States for their professional education.

Through the perseverance of the Agent, Rev. A. F. Waller, the new college building will be occupied at the next session. It is well furnished with Rankin's patent seats,* and will accommodate about four hundred students. The grant of mission lands near Salem to the University, and its endowment in the form of real estate and scholarship notes, renders its permanence secure; but as the interest only from these sources can be used, it is necessary to depend considerably upon the

income from tuition and the contributions of the friends of education among us. The library, apparatus and cabinet are quite respectable, but accessions are constantly being made, and are solicited.
